RECYCLING

Many people believe that stewardship of the planet is an important and worthwhile goal. We urge you to establish or expand the recycling program in your place of worship, social hall, parsonage or other properties.

Recycling in the Church or Temple

The most common items recycled are bulletins, prayer pamphlets, missalettes or hymnals. Hardbound covers should be removed before recycling.

The Office

Offices generate large amounts of paper, catalogues, magazines and brochures that should also be separated from trash for recycling.

Recycling in the Social Hall

Many places of worship have social halls or basements for congregations to assemble or have social events. The same items produced in the kitchen at home would also be generated at social get-togethers. These items are cans, glass bottles and jars and plastic containers. Lids should be removed and containers rinsed.

Recycling in the Parsonage

If a parsonage, rectory or residence for a priest, minister or rabbi is part of the complex, recycling should also take place just as it would in any other household. Most programs will include mixed paper, glass bottles and jars, aluminum and steel cans and plastic bottles #1 and #2. Many programs today include empty aerosol containers and plastic containers 3-7 excluding Styrofoam.
