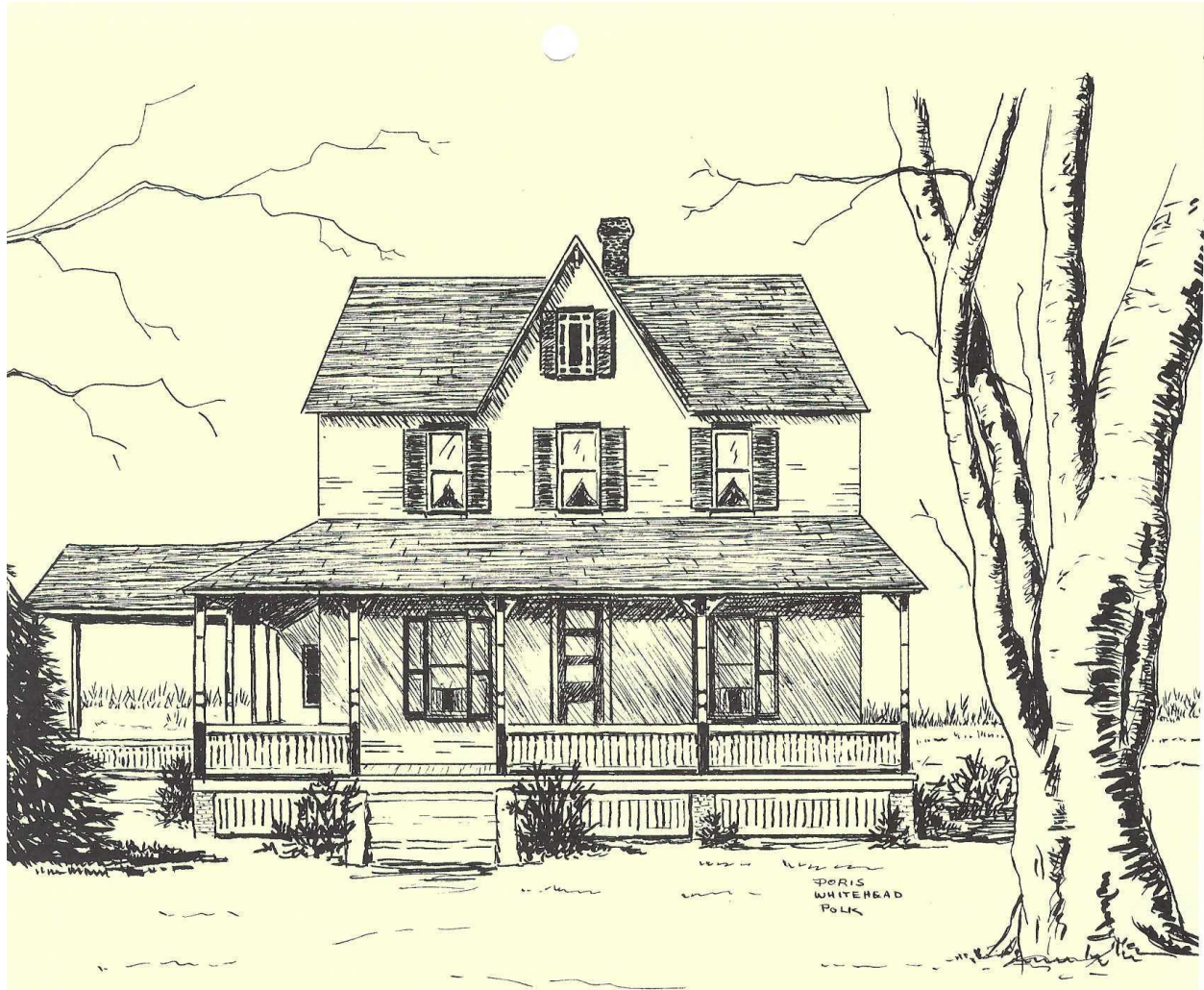

 - The Files and binders missing from the Township office and the re-purposing of the Historical Commission lateral filing cabinet still have not been located, Joe McCormick met with administrative staff to review what is missing.

 - b. **Community Park – Strunk Fallout Shelter**
 - Chad Peterson to prepare the photo scan survey conducted prior to securing the shelter entrances.
 - Sue Monaghan to submit the Boy Scout Eagle Project information on the Shelter.
 - c. **470 Buck Run Road**
 - Tax Parcel 47-7-84 1, listed in Township Historic Resource Inventory as a Class II, 2 ½ - story Greek Revival, ca 1840.
 - Owner has expressed intent to have the property removed from East Fallowfield Historic Resource Inventory, and subsequently demolish the structure.
 - A copy of Peg Young’s sketch of the property and descriptive caption was located. **See attached scan of the document.** Per Peg’s notes, the house was formerly the Jonathan Hampton House, ca. 1833, built on nineteen acres purchased from Enoch Harlan in 1830, with a barn built in 1884 by then owner Albert Walton, later owned by Arthur and Doris Polk, the later benign a well-known artist that document many local historic resources in her sketches.

JONATHAN HAMPTON HOUSE - 1833

Location: One mile south of Ercildoun on the Buck Run Road.

Jonathan Hampton purchased nineteen acres from Enoch Harlan in 1830 and built his house, described in an 1839 sales advertisement as a substantially built two story framed, lathed and plastered inside and out; a good frame barn, cellared under, log work shop. The buildings are all nearly new. The barn in 1884, while owned by Albert Walton, was burned and rebuilt the same year.

Home today of Arthur and Doris Polk, Polk's Country Flower Shop in Parkesburg, and Doris doing all but two of the sketches for all five of the calendars sold by the Fallowfield Historical Society.
