Modena Fire Company is Actively Seeking Volunteers... Chester County Lives Depend on it.

Firefighters are often called heroes, but these highly skilled individuals face more than dangerous flames. They rescue animals and people, treat injuries, lend a helping hand, and risk their lives – all while saving others.

But unlike big cities, the majority of rural firefighters are volunteers. Decades ago, community fire companies had no shortage of heroic volunteers willing to endure rigorous training in exchange for the pride in knowing they were able to help.

Like many once-thriving industries, the volunteer firefighting community has dwindled and one company, Modena Fire Company, which is one of the two fire companies that provides fire and rescue service to East Fallowfield Township, is fighting back by participating in a recruitment campaign called HelpFightFire.com. "The campaign, spearheaded by the Chester County Fire Chief's Association, will help make it easy to understand the many opportunities available as a volunteer," said Frank Dowlin, Fire Chief of Modena Fire Company.



"While Modena Fire Company currently has 22 active members who fight fires, five fire police members, and eight volunteer EMT's, these numbers are half what they were in 2010," said Chief Dowlin. "As there are more calls coming in and fewer people to respond to them, we have a need for more volunteers," Chief Dowlin said.

"We hope prospective volunteers will visit the website: www.HelpFightFire.com to learn more about becoming a volunteer," said Chief Dowlin. The website includes a volunteer inquiry form that interested candidates can fill out. Modena Fire Company will also participate in the East Fallowfield Township 'Park Day' event on October 12 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm to show off their emergency vehicles and perform rescue demonstrations. "Please stop by to say hello or inquire about becoming a volunteer," concluded Chief Dowlin.

Rain barrels are a valuable addition to any garden

Benefits to both the gardener and the environment

Site the barrels underneath a downspout to collect water from the roof each time it rains; the water can be saved and used to water plants in your yard.

- Save drinking water resources. On average, nearly 30% of our daily water use is attributed to lawn and garden care. Collecting water from rain events decreases the amount of drinking water used to water plants and after all, clean, fresh water is a limited, precious resource!
- Decrease water and sewer bills. Capturing rainwater also keeps money in your pocket by reducing the amount of water needed from public water.
- Utilize higher quality water for plants. Water collected from rain events is better for plants than treated water (which often contains chlorine).
- Reduce nonpoint source pollution. Nonpoint source pollution is created as rainwater passes over land surfaces and picks up contaminants enroute to our local streams and rivers (i.e. driveways and roads are coated with motor oil residue and road salt; agricultural fields often have fertilizers and pesticides applied). Since rain barrels reduce the amount of water that runs off your property, they




also reduce the amount of nonpoint source pollution that can harm aquatic and human life.

East Fallowfield Township Completes 2019 Road Paving Program

East Fallowfield Township is making significant progress in meeting the Road Maintenance Program goal to provide excellent street conditions throughout the Township. Municipal officials recently announced that road paving on Lehigh Drive, Columbia Drive, Lyons Lane, West Chester Road (section), Wagner Lane, and Mount Carmel Road had been completed.

"Keeping our road network in excellent shape is a high priority for the Township's Board of Supervisors and administration," said Township Manager Scott Swichar. The Board of Supervisors had awarded the \$174,994 road paving contract to John A. DiRocco of Downingtown, the low bidder on the paving project. There were seven bidders total. "We're very pleased with their work," said "Tag" Gathercole, East Fallowfield Township's Road Foreman. "They did a good job."



Free Electronics Recycling for East Fallowfield Township Residents- A HUGE SUCCESS

East Fallowfield Township Manager Scott Swichar recently announced that the Township's permanent electronics drop-off program that began last spring has been an overwhelming success. Since April, the Township has collected more than 250 old televisions and computer monitors and more than 100 old computers and laptops from residents, thereby diverting this material from entering the trash stream. As state law prohibits certain electronics from being disposed at landfills, the permanent collection site at the Township Building provides a free year-round option to dispose of these electronics.



"Before we began the program, our public works crews were constantly picking up televisions that were being dumped on the side of the road. Now residents

have a safe and legal alternative to properly dispose and recycle certain electronic items. As a result, we've seen far fewer televisions being dumped on the side of the road," Swichar said.



$How\, Can {\it IRecycle Computers, Laptops, TVs, Monitors, and Certain Electronic Equipment?}$

The Township's drop-off site is located at the Township Building (2264 Strasburg Road). The site is open weekdays from 8AM to 4:00PM, unless the Township is closed due to a holiday. No appointment is necessary, and the service is free. However, anyone dropping off electronics MUST first stop at the Administrative Office and show a valid ID or a copy of a utility bill identifying that they are a resident of East Fallowfield Township. Electronics may NOT be left outside at the Municipal Building or collection site when the facility is closed.

All materials are recycled, refurbished, and reused, or disposed of properly. "The

Electronics Drop-Off Recycling Program is provided at no cost to East Fallowfield Township taxpayers, and, in fact saves the Township money via lower trash disposal fees, making it both an environmental and fiscal win," concluded Swichar. Unacceptable Items include:

- Any fossil fuel or materials used in collecting fossil fuels.
- Lead Acid Batteries.
- Any infectious or biological wastes or equipment that contained them.
- Any media contaminated with oil.
- Any liquid.
- Any chemicals, oils, or powders.
- Any equipment that contains chemicals of any kind.
- Any equipment that contains asbestos.
- Any equipment that contains radioactive components.
- Any materials that are not integral to the original new equipment or otherwise associated with normal commercial or household environments that could adversely impact our operations or result in environmental or health and safety concerns.

East Fallowfield Township's Advice for Homeowners: "WHEN IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT"

East Fallowfield Township strives to decrease the contaminants in the recycling process, therefore, if there is a doubt whether an item is recyclable, it is best to throw it in the garbage. "While our residents have done an incredible job stepping

up their recycling efforts, the biggest challenge is reducing the amount of contamination that occurs when nonrecyclables are placed in recycling bins," said Township Manager Scott Swichar. "We all love the ease of placing all our recyclables in one container and having them whisked away to see new life as an upcycled product. However, the biggest drawback of single stream recycling is the risk of contamination of these recyclables."

"Just one rogue item - such as a plastic grocery bag – could contaminate an entire batch of recycling; meaning the batch of recycling could end up in a landfill rather than at a recycling facility," said Swichar.

"People often recycle the wrong things," Swichar said. "Our goal is to educate residents to recycle better and not contaminate the stream."



Township Staff inspected the Total Recycle Inc. recycling facility in Birdsboro, PA earlier this year. This is the facility where all of East Fallowfield Township's recycling goes to be sorted and baled to be remade into something new.

While plastic grocery bags are the most common item in the recycling bin that shouldn't be there, other contaminants like food scraps or yard waste are improperly placed in the recycling containers as well. Residents should rinse containers, especially those with thicker products like peanut butter and tomato paste, and only place yard waste, such as grass clippings, in paper bags or containers designated strictly for yard waste. While plastic bags can be thrown away with regular household trash, most grocery stores also collect plastic bags near their entranceways so they can be recycled.

"If we are all more diligent about what we throw away in our recycling container, we can improve on an already great program," concluded Swichar.






The Results are in...2019 East Fallowfield **Communications Survey is Complete**

This past summer, East Fallowfield Township conducted an online Communications Survey to residents through the online survey tool, Survey Monkey. 277 residents participated in the online survey. The survey gathered data about how the Township can improve its communications with its residents. More specifically, the Township wanted to know whether residents are viewing its website (www. eastfallowfield.org), following the Township's Facebook page (www.facebook.com/eastfallowfieldtownship), reading the Township's print newsletter mailed to all residents twice a year and the Township's e-newsletter; or whether they are receiving Township news from other sources, such as the online site, Nextdoor. We asked respondents to prioritize in the order of importance these formats and platforms.

"As a result of the survey, we learned that the top three forms of communications preferred by residents are the Township website, the Township's print newsletter, and the Township's Facebook page," said Township Manager Scott Swichar.





As part of the survey, residents were also asked whether the Township should consider other communication methods to better deliver its messages such as installing a permanent electronic message sign outside the Township Building or Community Park. The Township even field tested a digital sign at these two locations during two separate weekends in June. "The test gave residents the opportunity to view a digital sign close-up and decide if it is an effective way to deliver Township news and important messages," said Swichar.

The survey results indicate that 44% of the participants do not want to see a digital sign installed at the Township Building or Park. There were also 276 comments posted

about the digital sign. "While many residents were enthusiastic about receiving up-to-minute news on a digital sign, other residents were concerned about potential high costs of installing a sign or the impact it would have on the rural character of East Fallowfield Township," said Swichar.

"Thank you to everyone who participated in the survey. The survey answers and comments will provide guidance to the Township's Board of Supervisors and administration and will be used as the basis for ongoing discussions on how we can best utilize technology to improve communications with our residents," said Swichar. "We learned some very important information about how we communicate with the community, which will help us improve our efforts," concluded Swichar.
