

MEETING SUMMARY:

PRESENTATION

Pete Simone (PS), Michelle Armour (MA) and Pankaj Jobanputra of Simone Collins (SC) led the group through a brief presentation which included the following elements:

- Nina Pietro – resident to be added to Steering Committee.
- Brainstorming
 - Committee Member (CM): **Fact** - The existing master plan for the other half of East Fallowfield Township (EFT) Park includes fields. I like this plan. Someone suggested that we need a tot lot.
 - CM: **Fact/Question** - On the Comprehensive Plan, there were proposed connections to the Chester Valley Trail (CVT). I thought CVT was in Exton?
 - Peter Simone (PS): It's planned to go into town; into Coatesville.
 - Kate Clark (KC): Plans are to connect to existing terminus of the CVT all the way across the County, we have plans on website, individual municipalities are listed.
 - PS: If we connect to the train station, we will connect to the CVT as well.
 - CM: **Comment** - When I attended this month's Township meeting, my understanding that this plan is about trails. What you (SC) presented was a very broad plan, quite overwhelming; went from something narrow to something broad. Narrow down concepts, goals. My understanding was something very narrow, now something very broad.
 - PS: SC will help you figure out where you're going, maybe we will send out scope to everyone; it is very broad. SC will be very efficient. This plan is to be a blueprint for the future.
 - CM: **Comment** – In the Flats in Coatesville, there has been discussion for years about the Velodrome (bicycle destination).
 - PS: I have read that it is moving forward; seemed like it was almost definite.
 - CM: Will it be open to the public?
 - PS: We are working on a plan in Upper Macungie where the Trexler Velodrome is located. If it happens, will it be good?
 - Kate Collar (KC): At the County level, we received a land development plan for it.

- PS: Seems like a real project. The one in Trelxertown can be used by the public at certain times.
- CM: **Goal** – Would like to see all open space in the Township clearly labeled, regardless of use.
- CM: **Comment** – Concerned about passive improvements; do not have a large budget for maintenance
 - PS: We try to be conscious of maintenance money; there is a balance. Passive Open Space costs less to maintain. For example, the Beagle Club site likely has many invasive plants which are not of high value.
- CM: Thinking about preserves, like White Clay Creek.
- CM (Park and Rec Chair): **Goal** – Would like to see improvements to EFT Park – pond dredging, ADA access, trails improvements (steep trails).
 - PS: We specifically ask about the park on survey.
- CM: **Question** – Do we have an idea of how many people use the park? Should that be looked into?
 - PS: We could get volunteers to do counts; depending upon weather, there will be different numbers.
 - Scott Swichar (SS): We look at the parking lot to do counts. When we see the lot is full, the question comes up; do we need more parking?
 - PS: Other thing that will affect this is if you create additional facilities, like a dog park, which can increase usage. Let's use existing resources well. We will benchmark other communities with comparable populations and socioeconomic data; we will compare EFT to these other communities' parks and open space systems. There are also published standards for active recreation. These will give you a "temperature" as to how EFT is doing. There are no standards for passive recreation. We will work with the Committee and the Township to see what other people are doing.
- PS noted that in Solebury Township, Bucks County, 39% of the land is preserved from development.
- CM: **Question** – Solebury has preserved their land as is?
 - PS: Yes, this requires having money, because you're getting tax break and not developing land. West Bradford floated a bond issue for \$26 million to purchase the old hospital site for open space.

- CM: **Question** – Do police have clickers that tell you how many people drive on road? Maybe have that?
 - CM: **Question** – Years ago, they did road surveys; do they still do that?
 - PS: Nowadays they will do a traffic impact study. Traffic grows a little bit every year, and the pandemic changed many things; if you have an office-type job you are likely working from home. My guess is that nothing we propose will radically increase traffic. Let’s say you have some active sports fields; you may have a peak on a Saturday.
- CM: **Fact** - Downingtown dog park is often packed.
- CM: **Fact/Question** – You (SC) mentioned “maintain”. Caln Township has an open space management plan. Will you give recommendations to maintain what we will do? Can the Township adopt what Caln has and tailor it for use here?
 - PS: Depending on the facility, maintenance varies. Many communities, like Kenneth Square, have a recreation authority; they’ve taken over maintenance. Every community does it differently.
 - SS: **Fact** – Public Works maintains parks.
 - PS: The Township will probably need to bring in seasonal labor. SC can give you ballparks for maintenance costs. Maybe you want to separate numbers. Many communities go to a percentage of Earned Income Tax (EIT) to help fund parks and rec. Not a perfect formula. We will come up with a list of priorities and how to fund it moving forward.
- CM: **Comment** – I do not think you have the police property on the list of Township properties.
 - PS: Yes, we will add that; it might make sense to consolidate.
- CM: **Question** – Does the Township maintain the open space that it has now?
 - PS: Not much is happening on the Goosetown Road property. There likely are invasive plants, spotted lantern flies, deer, etc.
- CM: **Fact** – Deer are a problem in this Township. If you want natural areas to have high ecological health, you need to do management.
 - CM: **Concept** – At some point, maybe culling them is a strategy.
- PS: Does the Committee have ideas as to where connections might be?

- **CM: Fact** – We are poorly connected. We designed a connector from the east to the west side of the park, with a bridge and paved trails. It was very expensive.
- **CM: Question** – Understanding park paths better – what about bike paths? Is there a cost to the Township?
 - **PS:** Yes, there is a trade-off. Do you want a connection and want it to be maintained, or keep a natural trail? The number one issue is safety; trails need to be designed to standards so they are safe.
- **CM: Question** – How do you make a bike trail on Route 82?
 - **PS:** We will give you examples; a “Trails 101.” Depending on how much right-of-way is available, you can have an improved shoulder, then bike lane, then protected bike lane. Cyclists are permitted on all roads except limited access highways and motorists need to give them 4 feet of clearance.
- **CM: Fact** – We have a train station on the border of EFT and Caln; Thorndale Station. What was the rationale of creating a trail connection to Coatesville?
 - **PS:** Whoever did the master plan probably saw Route 82 as a direct route, but we will look at Thorndale.
 - **CM: Comment** – Think Ott chose Coatesville maybe because it is an Amtrak station.
 - **PS:** You have residential neighborhoods where some may go to Caln and others use Amtrak.
- **CM: Question** – Will people have facilities to charge e-bikes?
 - **PS:** We are planning for the future, and things will change. Our office is in Norristown, and the connection from the Schuylkill River Trail to the Chester Valley Trail was recently completed across the street from our office. We see continuous growth on the trail. The trail from Valley Forge National Historic Park to Philadelphia took 25 years. We (the U.S.) are in the infancy of bike trail planning; Europe is decades ahead.
 - **CM: Comment** – In Europe, the cities and towns are much more accommodating to bicycles.
 - **PS:** We are bike trail advocates. The points you brought up about safety are important now.

- CM: **Partners** – Modena and Caln should be partners. The West Chester Road open space site butts up to Caln. There is a development there, and the road ends going toward the junction with us at Eagleston Blvd.
 - PS: We did the transportation plan for Caln.
 - CM: **Partners** – Put in all neighbors as partners.
- PS: The Comprehensive Plan is a big document; in that goes this Recreation Plan, this is part of the Comprehensive Plan.
- CM: **Fact** – Being consistent with Landscapes3 is important. The Brandywine Greenway followed the trail shown on the Official Map.
 - KC: The Brandywine Conservancy did a plan.
 - PS: Brandywine Greenway Plan is a visionary plan. The “rub” comes in when you have to acquire hundreds of easements. If we can make something safe on the Creek along the brownfield site, it would be a great recreational addition.
- CM: **Fact** – The proposed Misty Loop Trail goes near an exceptional value stream; there are some areas of high value.
 - PS: Trails come in all types. If an area has high ecological value, not every trail will be paved; some can be earthen paths. Not every trail can be made ADA accessible. The facility needs to be designed to fit the environment.
- CM: **Partners** – PECO, DCNR, Chester County Natural Lands Trust should be partners.
- PS: If the Beagle Club property were preserved as open space, a conservation easement could be placed on it. Natural Lands Trust is an expert at this.
- CM: **Fact** – There’s a 99-year lease on Equivine Farm, on Strasburg.
 - PS: We will look at it.
- CM: **Fact** – Goosetown Rd property has restrictions on use: (gazebo/parking only).



MEETING SUMMARY:

PRESENTATION

Pete Simone (PS), Michelle Armour (MA) and Pankaj Jobanputra (PJ) of Simone Collins (SC) led the group through a brief presentation which included the following elements:

NOTES:

- Nina: Is the proposed Misty Loop Trail part of an existing home development?
 - SC: Portions of the proposed trail run through existing HOA lands.
- Nina: What are the plans for the elementary school site?
 - PJ: We will talk with the school district about their future plans.
 - Nina: Can we attend?
 - PS: No; it will be an informal meeting. Also, we do not want to overwhelm them with a large group at the meeting. We will share notes from the meeting with the Committee.
- **Mission Statement**
 - PS: This draft mission statement is a suggestion – a starting point.
 - Committee Member (CM): The statement does not say anything about acquiring more open space.
 - PS: It also does not exclude acquisition. Usually, a mission statement is very broad so that it can include many things, and the goals and objectives are more specific as to how to accomplish the broader mission.
- Joe: Are cultural/historic resources within the scope of this study?
 - PJ: Yes.
 - PS: It is included in the mapping of Township inventory. These resources are important in retaining the culture and character of the Township. The inventory from the County was very complete.
 - Joe: Trailheads could be located at the sites of historic resources.
 - PJ: And there could be an historic marker placed at the trailheads.
- **Newlinville Village**

- Nina: Where is Newlinville Village?
 - Comment: The north of the Township, at Rte. 82 and Newlinville Rd.
- Comment: The existing Master Plan for Newlinville Village makes recommendations which include speed controls and buffers.
- Mike: The goal of the Newlinville Master Plan was walkability. A major restriction is that Rte. 82 is a state road. We are putting in traffic calming measures and stormwater management in the area.
- Nina: Do residents want more walkability in Newlinville?
 - Mike: Yes; it is not currently safe. There are row homes on Rte. 82. A bus stop is at Rte. 82 and Madison St./Charles St. north of Newlinville. Technically, there is no street parking allowed, but people do. Community comments have been that they want improvements but do not want anyone to come there – for example, we suggested a food establishment to attract visitors, and the community said no. They expressed a desire for sidewalks, traffic calming, and maybe a flagpole.
- Nina: That area has a very steep hill; I do not know how they will navigate there.
- Scott: The official map asks for a trail along Rte. 82, but there is challenging topography. There is a paper street there - did you (SC) see the paper street? It is easy to miss.
- PS: Yes, it is very steep, and the topography is difficult to navigate.
- **Brandywine Greenway (Brandywine Conservancy)**
 - PS: The plan is very aspirational, and I imagine many paths developed will likely be footpaths; is that how the County views this plan?
 - Kate: Yes, it is a high-level plan. Improvements need to go into engineering/feasibility and will be based on context.
 - PS: The Conservancy looked at simple trails along creeks – these will require multiple easements. This will take many years if it goes forward.
- Wilson: After looking at the mission statement, thinking about acquiring access to open space, and then considering what SC presented – the Brandywine Conservancy has said that the public should have access to the lands that are deeded as open space. There is a lot of open space in East Fallowfield, but it is in land trusts. The Conservancy says public should have access, which can provide opportunity for economic benefits – these things need to be in line with the mission statement. So, it needs to be written into the deeds that land be provided as an easement for public access. Otherwise, what is the purpose?

- PS: Sometimes land is put into conservancy, typically with public access. Another type is an access where the property owner gets a tax benefit in exchange for not developing the land. These lands with no public access can provide other benefits: stormwater management, habitat, etc. There are different types of protection. The Township's governing body needs to decide what might happen. For example, a property owner may not want public access – in the south of the Township, maybe this makes sense, in other locations, maybe not.
We have worked with access easements written by attorneys that have no relationship to what is happening on the land. If you have an easement come before you, I suggest you have an engineer, planner, or landscape architect make sure the easement makes sense in relationship to the land. Wilson's point is a good one. The situation can vary based on the easement and who is holding it.
- Nina: What is the definition of stormwater management? Is it topography? Or is it the municipality making sure that areas where stormwater collects on roadways because of clogged grates are addressed, which will have an impact of safety on County roads?
 - PS: In the context of this study –When the Township goes through the land development process, it is mandated that no more water should leave the developed site than did before the development. In this case, the municipality needs a 5-year plan to improve stormwater quality. In the past, stormwater basins were typically used. Now, we need to infiltrate stormwater into the ground.
SC can help the Township meet EPA-mandated Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) requirements by suggesting locations for best management practices (BMPs). The Township cannot get grant money for meeting MS4 alone, but you can get funds for park improvements. When developing a park and the required stormwater management BMPs for the site, the BMPs can be oversized to meet the greater stormwater management needs in the Township. In other words, you can get funding for parks and simultaneously save money on meeting MS4 requirements.
- Nina: What is SALDO?
 - PJ: SALDO stands for Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance.
- Nina: Regarding sharrows – what is the marking on the road on the right side of the presentation slide? When on the road, I would like to see a symbol that indicates bicycles clearly.
 - PS: The road marking on the slide is a symbol indicating a bicycle. The symbol can vary. A clear symbol can be chosen by the Township.
- Question: Who sets speed limits?

- PS: It varies, depending on ownership.
- Route 82 is a state route, so in this case the state sets the speed limit.
- Mike: The Township has an historic register, which may be more up to date. One of the properties shown on the map in the presentation is new.
 - PS: Thank you for pointing this out. SC will find the Township's historic register.
 - Kate: Yes, the Chester County Historic Atlas is an ongoing project, which was started decades ago, and continues to be updated. The Township information is likely more current.
- Comment: The proposed trail along the powerline property is out.
 - PS: Yes, it seems so, per PECO's new restrictions.
- **Advertising the Plan and Public Participation**
 - Question: Are you relying on the Committee to disseminate flyers (vs. the Township)?
 - Scott: The Township has posted to the Township's website and in local businesses.
 - Question: How about sending out mailers?
 - PS: Mailers are a good idea.
 - Nina: I received a mailed ad for concerts at the park. It would be good to send mailed ads for this plan – it would reach more people. Primarily, this Township is residents 60 years and older, so having something tangible to put on the fridge would be helpful. Would the Township consider doing this?
 - Scott: The challenge is the cost of sending out mailers.
 - Comment: How about bringing handouts to the concert in the park tomorrow?
 - Comment: I have some printed and ready.
 - Comment: Making announcements at the concert before the bands go on would be a great way to spread info.
 - Comment: The Township could offer a door prize – free raffle ticket for filling out survey.
 - Comment: Advertise on the bulletin board on the roadway – it gets a lot of attention.
 - Question: Does the Township have a list of HOA contacts?

- Scott: It has been difficult because they change frequently. When we do contact them, it is hit or miss on whether we receive a response. We have posted in Facebook groups as well.
 - Question: Public Opinion Survey – Is it legitimate to pre-print and hand it out at concerts?
 - PS: We can do both – hand out a postcard with the QR code for people to fill out the survey online or, if more comfortable, have a paper survey to be input manually into the survey website to be compared alongside online submissions.
- **Public Meeting 1 Preparation**
 - Comment: I suggest you have a microphone because, while the Committee is a small group, the acoustics may not be as good with more people. Attendees will need to be able to hear. Also, visibility – can you use a pointer?
 - PS: We cannot use a pointer with the TV screen – projector only.
 - Scott: We were talking about having the meeting outdoors, in the parking lot here.
 - PS: We can do that, or we could make it work indoors.



NOTES:

- Comment: The population projection shows 28% - is that accurate?
 - Peter Simone (PS): That is data from DVRPC, not by SC, from the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC). We find that it is pretty close.
- Comment: The Return on Environment (ROE) study mentioned increased property values from walking trails – I think a walking trail through my property would decrease its value.
 - PS: What about walking trails near or outside of your property? We find that trails are the most controversial topic; I can think of only one project that we have done where there was no controversy. There are all kinds of trails: walking trails, trails on rights-of-way, sidewalks. This Township is not in a regional location, so you will get local people walking the trails here; it is not going to be regional.
- Comment: Regarding East Fallowfield Community Park: I have traveled a lot, I like the concept where there are a lot of trees, also colonnades (lines of trees). Strasburg has long areas of long grass; there could be trees here. I also would like fountains or a water feature; a few in different areas might be liked by people.
 - PS: Trees also have environmental benefits; you can add trees back to the landscape. They also reduce the effects of heat.
- Comment: Wo would pay for all this?
 - PS: Funding can come from several places. As we get into the plan, we will document sources – there is Township money, as well as sources for grants: DCNR, DCED, Federal and State sources. Our firm writes grants for clients; we got Chadds Ford \$3.5 million to build a trail. The funds are available for public recreation, and if your Township does not apply for

them, they will go somewhere else. We suggest to the Township that, if you are going to spend money, get it matched with a grant and double your money. Someone once paid for East Fallowfield Community Park – was that a good decision? Not for our firm to decide – this is up to the community.

- Comment: One main concern: I came down to the park and first saw the pond, I thought, “This is nice. Kids can enjoy fishing.” But over the years, this pond has gone from 6 feet of water to 2 feet – it needs to be dredged. I contacted a company to provide a proposal. It is of utmost importance to have this pond available for youth. As far as funding, there’s federal and state grants, and private grants like AFTCO (American Fishing Tackle Company), BASS (Bass Anglers Sportsman Society), sporting organizations that like to contribute as well.
- Comment: Can you do anything with easements?
 - PS: Our understanding is that when owners have an easement, they get a tax benefit in exchange for a promise not to develop the land. I do not believe any in the Township have granted public access, but we will ask.
- Comment: The brownfield site is very nice. Can anything be done with it?
 - PS: We think you can do something with it. We think it is covered and could have recreational use on top; we are investigating. We think it has great potential because it is a beautiful spot.
- Comment: I would prefer wood or mulch or gravel trails.
 - PS: Sometimes this approach is right; but to make them ADA accessible, as we propose trails, we have to balance those needs.
- Comment: Think it would be great if we put in more bike trails and coordinate with other municipalities to create longer trails.
 - PS: We will look at what your neighbors are doing. The challenges here are that, generally, cyclists who use Strava are experienced, and we want to accommodate inexperienced users, as well.
- Comment: What impact does designating a road as a trail have on the road?
 - PS: Generally, if there is a biker on road, it is the motorists’ responsibility to give them 4 feet of clearance when passing. The first method would be “Sharrows” (share the road). Then, if the road is wide enough, you may have an improved shoulder. The next step up would be a bike lane with a painted line. This is the progression and, if we design trails, they need to be based on safety standards.
 - Comment: My road (Misty Patch Rd) is used as a bike route – I see 10-20 bikers at a time. If this proposed Misty Patch Loop trail is put in, how would that impact this road?

- PS: I think the Misty Patch Loop trail was meant to be walking trail; we will look at it. The proposed trail loop has HOA lands around it, and it can be difficult to get HOAs to allow use of their land. A lot of this area is beautiful and heavily wooded, so it probably would not change anything; maybe some signage would be added to alert motorists to be careful.
- Comment: Youth organizations as partners, like AAU (Amateur Athletic Union). We do not have little league or other leagues – kids go everywhere but here.
 - PS: We will talk to local sports groups.
- Comment: As far as concepts are concerned, one park put in exercise equipment, checkerboard; could something like this be put into Community Park? Also, disc golf.
 - PS: Disc golf players are very dedicated.
- Comment: It would be great if we had pickleball courts.
 - PS: A major concern with pickleball is noise; we would have to locate courts away from residences.
- Comment: Designated places for bird watching – some spots could be more private for just that. We have 2 parcels that are not being used, so maybe they could be for that.
 - Comment: On that comment about bird watching, I was involved with the construction of Poole Wildlife Sanctuary. There are bird blinds set up, and they are very effective.
- Comment: As far as partners, there are a lot of breweries. They do nature stuff; maybe we could have a beer named for East Fallowfield, and the money could go to the park.
 - PS: Breweries and other local businesses could be listed as potential partners.
- Comment: More expansion of facilities in Community Park, working from the master plan.
 - PS: The master plan was never fully implemented; we will see what could be added. The Township has been trying to improve access across the bridges in the park.
- Comment: A small, natural amphitheater with a stage; we have slopes where people could sit.
 - SS: Concerts are currently held on the silo base.
- Comment: Would like to focus on Dennis Run waterways. It originates at the pond north of the police station, travels through East Fallowfield Park, then onto the east side of Buck Run Road Farm, crosses under Strasburg Rd, then

goes east under Youngsburg Rd, travels north of Beck Rd, then goes onto Beagle property, then goes into Modena, then into West Branch. I would like for the Township to own easements or land all along the creek. I also would like Township ordinance for protection of riparian buffer zones along Dennis Run. I would like to have ordinance for preservation of old pristine forest. At the Beagle Club, a year or two back, they timbered out pristine forest; that property also borders Modena. I would also like for the Township to acquire the Beagle Club and old Beck Farm to create a nature center.

- PS: We will look at Township ordinances to see if they can be improved.
- Comment: I think one challenge for the committee and public is that we have isolated possibilities; how can we interconnect these in some fashion? Anything that makes modular sense, and which takes advantage of ROWs?
 - PS: Connecting the new Township building and school site to the park should be easy. What about the Beagle Club? Along Dennis Run could make sense, but easements would have to be purchased. There is always negotiation for easements.
- Comment: HOAs clustered in the eastern quadrant – there is already opportunity here, with a mass of people that need to be served. On West Chester Rd, the latest development is Ridge Crest; you interconnect to Brinton Station development and get people opportunities to get to Thorndale train station.
 - PS: This is a possibility, if you can make easements public and connect from one HOA to another – there is a process of education that needs to happen.
- Comment: W. Chester Rd – Caln has Hills of Thorndale Woods in the land development (LD) process.
- Comment: There is an access road between Brook Crossing and Branford Village. Also, there are flat areas in the park that could be used for pickleball or tennis courts and a pool, also walking paths. The access road ends before you get to walking path – retaining wall there.
 - Comment: You can hike around there.
 - PS: Maybe part of phase 2 of the park master plan.
- Comment: The East Fallowfield website needs to be updated.
 - PS: We will get the maps and presentation up on the website.
- Comment: I would like someone to look into how Sadsbury acquired Sadsbury Preserve. Maybe Natural Lands owns it. For parking, off of Old Wilmington Rd is an area where you can park your car. Also, I do not like mechanical or motorized trails, want to maintain the rural character of the Township as much as possible.

- PS: Conservancies can also be partners.
- Comment: I know there is an equestrian community, and we have talked about the non-motorized biking community; what about ATVs? Some are enthusiastic about it.
 - PS: The ATV community is unique; you probably do not have areas that are appropriate, unless it is private land.
- Comment: The piece of land we own above Modena, on Goosetown Rd – There is a house for sale there, and 2 houses in front on Mortonville Rd. Also, if we can get access to Mortonville, we can access the brownfield site along the Creek. If you can connect the forested area to the brownfield, you can get canoe access.
- Comment: Regarding the Goosetown Rd. property – In steep areas, you see mountain bikes.
 - PS: The site is probably not big enough for mountain bikes; you need parking. This might be a place for bird watching. It will be difficult to use this site without making any changes.
- Comment: Parkesburg Train Station is close – right off Strasburg Rd. The line goes to NYC (same line as Coatesville Station).
- Comment: It might be beneficial to advertise that the opinion survey is open until February
 - Comment: We should post the link on Facebook as well.
 - Scott Swichar: To SC – please send the link and QR codes.



MEETING SUMMARY:

PRESENTATION

Pete Simone (PS), Michelle Armour (MA) and Pankaj Jobanputra (PJ) of Simone Collins (SC) led the group through a brief presentation which included the following elements:

- Introduction
- Mission Statement, Goals & Objectives – Draft
- Public Participation Update
- Benchmarking
- Park Service Areas / Gaps

- Potential Open Space & Rec Expansion / Acquisition
- Conceptual Trail Connections
- Review of Master Plan for Community Park
- Next Steps

NOTES:

Public Participation; Public Opinion Survey Results; Community Benchmarking

- Committee Member (CM): The parcels adjacent to the Goosetown Rd. parcel have been sold.
- CM: Where is Old Beck Farm?
 - Simone Collins (SC): Adjacent to the Beagle Club? **SC to confirm.**
- CM: It is surprising to see that such a large portion of survey respondents are residents of 0-5 years.
- CM: Kerr Park has active recreation – sports fields, etc.
- CM: HOA trails vs. public trails – do people (the public) use trails on HOA land? Are they policed? Are HOAs amenable to trail connections?
 - SC: Typically, not amenable, but it is our due diligence to ask.
- CM: Are the people moving into the Township younger?
 - SC: **SC to analyze the survey results to break down the demographics.**
- CM: Are we, as the committee, along with township officials, to be careful planners to provide for the needs for the future population of the township?
 - SC: Yes. SC will provide information and recommendations, but the committee will make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors who make the final decisions.
- CM: Do you have unit pricing on sports fields and courts?
 - SC: We can provide that information but would advise not considering costs at this point. The reason for creating this plan is to use it as a basis for applying for grants.
- CM: Did you look at the Ray Ott plans for Community Park?
 - SC: Yes, we will get to that (in presentation).

Park Service Areas/Gaps; Potential Open Space & Rec Expansion/Acquisition

- CM: Why is the bottom half of the Township considered “low need” (per the DCNR 10-minute Walk Access map)?
 - SC: The DCNR tool takes into account factors other than literal distance from parks and recreation facilities, such as population density and distance via walkable routes.
- CM: Regarding the park service gaps – the one in the northeast along West Chester Rd is so small, it seems almost pointless.
 - SC: **Possible for SC to remove that one.**
- CM: On the map indicating possible open space parcels for acquisition/conservation, if there are duplicate open space properties from official map, it may take wind out of the sails.
 - SC: **SC to mark which parcels came from the official map.**
- CM: What criteria do you use to determine suitability for possible acquisition?
 - We will go over that shortly (in presentation).
- CM: The open space criteria does not take into account the fact that the brownfield is a brownfield.

- SC: This is true. However, many parks have been placed over capped brownfields. **SC to continue attempts to obtain more information on the brownfield site.**
- CM: Are most of the criteria based on topography?
 - SC: Not just topography – size, proximity to communities, etc.
- CM: There was not much controversy over parcels marked on the official map; more so on proposed locations for pumping stations.
- CM: Doesn't the presence of prime agricultural soil preclude development of a site?
 - PS: Not necessarily. For example, in the process of park development, DCNR will ask if there are prime agricultural soils present on site; this does not exclude the ability to develop. Also, if there is a situation in the future where the soil is needed for agricultural use, park improvements are often relatively easily reverted to this use.

Conceptual Trail Connections

- CM: Do e-bikes need to be registered?
 - SC: e-bikes do not need to be registered
- CM: Is it worth talking to PECO about trails – no?
 - SC: Correct, they have reversed policies (and are not allowing trail development under their lines). *(UPDATE: There is a new process for applicants to follow to develop trails along PECO rights-of-way.)*
- SC: Regarding bike/pedestrian improvements along Strasburg Rd. – likely, the best we can hope for is that the Township can work with PennDOT to widen the shoulders. PennDOT can do this through its “betterment program”. Road condition would likely not be appropriate for children or inexperienced cyclists to ride bicycles.
- SC: For Route 82, a side path would be the ideal solution, parallel to the road. This would require acquisition of additional right-of-way.
- CM: For on-road bike trails, is there a required speed limit?
 - SC: Not necessarily; if the Township wanted to pursue this on Strasburg Rd., it may be possible to have signs – “Bikes may use full lane”
- CM: Can roads be closed at certain times for bicycling?
 - SC: Sometimes they can be; for example, MLK Drive in Philadelphia is closed to vehicular traffic on the weekends.
- SC: For the rail trail concept, there may be 30 property owners who would need to provide an easement.
- CM: If sharrows are used, does there have to be painted lanes?
 - SC: Not a dedicated lane; it is a symbol painted in the lane of traffic.
- SC: Some of the trail routes on this map will likely be eliminated as we go along in this process.
- CM: Do HOAs have to take care of sidewalks?
 - CM: Homeowners must maintain them. Sometimes, when there are sidewalks in common areas, the HOA will just hire a company to do all sidewalks in the development.
- SC: For on-road routes, we will be within existing easements; it is a complex process that takes time.
- CM: When you improve the shoulder, you will have to do both sides.
 - PS: In a perfect world, yes, you would do both sides. If there is a situation where there is only room to widen the road on one side, the roadway may be realigned to create a wider shoulder on both sides.

- CM: Is it a law that bicyclists must travel in the direction of traffic?
 - SC: Yes.
- CM: There is a housing development in Caln near W. Chester Pike; that would be a great connection.
 - PS: It is much easier to put trails in during development vs. after. The Township, or SC (as the consultant) can talk to the Township Manager in Caln about it. **SC to follow up with East Fallowfield Township regarding this matter.**
- SC: We also show a bike route along Youngsburg Rd. Also, we will also extend a green off-road trail line on the trail map along 82 into Coatesville (to indicate an off-road route). **SC to make edits to the plan.**

East Fallowfield Township Community Park Master Plan

- CM: (In Community Park) there is an overflow parking lot – currently a gravel lot.
- CM: Regarding the large stones between the open play field walking loop and Buck Run Rd. – those rocks are pretty recent; is that for stormwater management (SWM)?
 - SC/Scott Swichar: Unsure. **SC to follow up.**
- CM: People take grass clippings and branches and throw them down by the paved ditch (along the gravel access road between Brook Crossing and Branford Village). Also, the path gets pretty wet.
- CM: I do not know what our consensus would be for clearing trees along western edge of Community Park (to develop park facilities in that location per the Park Master Plan).
 - SC: Remember that this plan was done 20 years ago. There is probably more forest there now than at the time, but we should focus on other facilities. If you want to pursue facilities (such as a tennis court, pickleball, playground, etc.), this is the best place to do it since the Township controls it. You might lose trees, but you can also plant them. Also, stormwater regulations are more stringent than they were at the time of the Park Master Plan.
 - CM: In a previous Township meeting, someone was questioned on the development of their property, regarding how many trees they were taking down and planning to replace, and whether these would be indigenous species.
 - SC: The Township can decide to follow these standards or waive them.
 - CM: That area of the woods is relatively new growth and consists mostly of scrub trees.
 - SC: If you are not going to put in additional facilities that the community desires here, where will you put them? Keep an open mind as to what you want to see implemented.
- SC: Frisbee golf could be a possible recreational activity in the meadow; it is very popular and low maintenance. This could go along the meadow and into the woods. Another possibility for this area is a dog park.
- Scott Swichar: The bridge to connect the 2 parts of Community Park needs to be handicapped accessible.
 - CM: The previous Park and Rec Board got a grant for the bridge, however, the high construction costs has stalled the project.
- SC: This park can be more developed with facilities that can serve the community.
- CM: The police building could become a pub or meeting house.
- CM: The building used to be a Pen and Ink Club (there is a book of pen and ink drawings that illustrates historic pubs in the area – they ran all along Strasburg Road).
- SC: At the police station, there is a parking lot; you are accessing an existing space. This is a sustainable way to introduce something new; maybe you have some other type of activity there.

- SC: At public meeting, SC will just propose these as ideas to develop the plan and get some reactions from the public.
- SC: In the meadow, maybe we incorporate a pollinator garden with a great mix of natives. We can also show a trail along the road near the meadow on the trails plan; this would be a paved side path that parallels the road. **SC to incorporate suggestions.**
- CM: Is a rugby field smaller than football? There (used to be) a rugby team in the Township.
 - SC: Believe it is larger than a football field. **SC to confirm.**
- SC: **SC to send the committee this presentation**; please give us your comments. We will present something similar at the public meeting. These are suggestions, food for thought. SC will show the plan and how it can be adapted to accommodate desired facilities. **SC to draw the master plan more succinctly.**

General Comments/Questions

- CM: Regarding the presentation/mapping graphics – from where we are sitting, I cannot see any landmarks. Maybe make the maps larger. Also, may I suggest using a laser pointer?
 - SC: **SC to use “zoomed in” plans and images and call out landmarks on the map with labels to orient participants for the public meeting presentation.**
- CM: Project your voices please.
 - SC: **SC to bring a speaker and microphones to the public meeting.**



NOTES:

- Comment: I like all the ideas. My concern is about bike trails; undesirables coming in from outside, security issues.
 - PS: That is often a concern. Crimes do happen on trails, but we don't find it to be higher than in the general community. Also, these connections are local trails – not regional.
 - Comment: I was on bike trails everyday in Colorado when I was younger – I loved them.
 - PS: We will explore more of the off-road trails.
- Question: Is this information posted online?
 - PS: This presentation will be on website. Also feel free to call or email us at SC.
- Question: How many people have taken the survey?
 - PS: About 270 – that is pretty good for a community of this size. We find the web survey is a pretty good barometer.
- Question: Does the survey ask if people actually own property?
 - PS: It asks if they live in the Township. There are not many apartments here, so my guess is that the majority of survey respondents are homeowners – likely to reflect overall renters/homeowners ratio in census. Also, we want to give everyone an equal voice. Renters are not necessarily “transients”. Also of note, DCNR funds are generated by property sales taxes.
 - Comment: It sounds like easements are part of the long-term plan, and those are relevant to property owners, so I'm curious about the weight being given to people whose properties may be subject to an easement.
 - PS: Easements involve a long and complicated process. Ex.: The Beagle Club property has been on the Township's official map as proposed open space since 2018, and nothing has happened yet. The Goosetown Road parcel was on the official map and the Township did buy that. It is a negotiated and long process. As years pass, different boards of supervisors may or may not have interest in pursuing recommendations of this plan.
- Question: What is your (SC's) role?

- PS: We were hired by the Township to plan for things looking at the future of parks and open space. We will give our best advice based on experience and, frankly, sometimes governing bodies take our advice, sometimes not. It is a recommendation. This document will have no legal teeth; it will be a planning guide.
- Question: Is “greenway” a generic term, or is that specific to the Brandywine Conservancy?
 - PS: It is a generic term. We need to look at your ordinances. For example, tree replacement ordinance – we might look at that and make recommendations. These ordinances are especially important along waterways. Township residents have well water, yes? These ordinances protect water quality – trees and other riparian vegetation help to clean and cool water. The Brandywine Greenway plan is a generational plan. Our recommendations may be more specifically about ordinances.
 - Comment: I think our entire township is in the Conservancy’s Greenway.
 - PS: That is a broader plan; I am talking more specifics with protections.
- Question: Can you address acquiring of land?
 - PS: People get concerned about eminent domain. It happens, but it is rare. No official wants to do it. But without it, you would not have schools, roads, etc., for the public good. Realistically, there are all kinds of scenarios. A municipality does not necessarily need an official map. A township can address a landowner and ask if they want to sell. What we are doing with the open space parcel map of potential expansion / acquisition is to address the deficiencies in the Township. By having parks near where people live, there can be close connections. If we identify 5-7 parcels, the Township might acquire one or two; it may be too expensive, or the property owner is not willing, etc. Here’s an example of negotiations with parcels on the official map: if a parcel marked on the official map for future open space is proposed to become residential development by a developer, the Township can negotiate with the developer for more compact units and more open space, etc. There are cases where residential developers create trails/open space that are not taxpayer funded but are open to the public.
- Question: Will the plan have a priority of recommendations? For example, in the park service gaps map, the one to the south of Mortonville Road is not densely populated so would not seem to be a high priority.
 - PS: There may not be priorities for specific parcels for acquisition; there will be more general recommendations in this regard. Other categories will have more specific priorities – park amenities, etc. However, in terms of sites – the brownfield site on Mortonville Road could be considered a high priority because of its high potential for use as open space/recreation (the only permitted use after remediation and monitoring is recreational).

- Question: Regarding bike trails and the Township’s challenging topography, winding narrow roads, etc.; can we safely accommodate use for a growing population?
 - PS: E-bikes are starting to change things – making topography easier to travel by bicycle.
 - Question: What about all bicyclists?
 - PS: PA state law requires a 4’ passing distance. There may not be many options in much of the Township. For example, on Strasburg Road, there may be opportunities to increase the shoulder by a few feet to make it safer to ride, but there may be no room along other areas on Strasburg and other roads.
 - Comment: Yes, the bridge on Strasburg is scary to ride.
 - PS: We will winnow down the routes before the next round.
- Question: Is identifying funding mechanisms in your (SC’s) scope?
 - PS: We will make recommendations. Dept. of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) gave over \$70 million in grant funding last year (more than a typical year). Dept. of Community and Economic Development (DCED), Chester County, and the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) are other sources of funding.
 - Comment: Thinking less about grants and more about revenue stream. What are other municipalities doing? Tax for open space, transfer of deeds, etc.?
 - PS: Here’s an example. We’re working in Upper Mount Bethel Township, they have a nature preserve and trail. They’re small, but they have a fund for acquisition, development, and maintenance. They can match this money to grant funding.
 - PS: In another example, Upper Saucon had an earned income tax referendum – failed at first, but was passed a few years later. The money goes into an open space fund.
 - PS: Another good example is from where I live, in Westtown Township, where residents overwhelmingly voted in favor of a referendum to float a \$22 million bond to help purchase Crebilly Farm.





MEETING SUMMARY:

Pete Simone opened the meeting with an update on developments with the Connell site on Mortonville Road.

- The Township has applied for an LSA grant to conduct a Master Plan study for the property. Matching funds are **not** required for this grant.
- The consultant (SC) and the Township have reviewed the Site Control Plan and have been in communication with the property owner, who also inspects and maintains the site, to gather information on the conditions of the site, required maintenance and monitoring.
- Discussion:
 - Committee Member (CM): Are there specific environmental due diligence reports available?
 - PS: Yes. **Scott Swichar to share with the Committee.**

- Needs to be maintained in perpetuity, inspected 1x/year (Connell's inspector currently goes out 2x/year.)
- CM: There is a report out on brownfields in the Delaware Valley. It shows that the majority of these sites have very little instance of harm. Some of these sites are being selected for mixed use. What is the reason for selecting the Connell site for recreation uses?
 - PS: This site is restricted to recreational uses, as mandated by the EPA . Also, with site constraints required to protect the integrity of the site "cap", building foundations would not be feasible on this site. In addition, residential uses must comply with a higher standard. Other factors include the site's location within the floodway/floodplain and the presence of wetlands.
- PS: One question to consider - If the Township does not acquire this site, who could? For example, what if the Brandywine Conservancy took this site and created a place for bird watching site.
 - SS: As of our most recent conversations, the Brandywine Conservancy is not interested in acquiring the site – it is not in their plan.
- CM: Would the woodlands on the site be in jeopardy if the Township gets this grant?
 - PS: No, due to the high presence of floodplain and wetlands; we are not sure that trails could even be put in on the wooded portion of the site.
- CM: Would the fencing have to be ugly? The current chain link fence is not appealing.
 - PS: No, there are options. For example, at Wissahickon Park in Whitpain Township, on the former Bo-Rit superfund site, we are specifying a black estate-style fence. The purpose of the fence is to allow the site to be secured in instances such as post-storm inspections.
- CM: This is a conversation for all stakeholders involved in this site.
 - PS: Conducting a Master Plan study would give the opportunity for that conversation.
- CM: Regarding the parcel in Modena – does Modena need to be consulted?
 - PS: No, Connell does not have to consult with Modena. Also, it is not uncommon for a Township to own parkland physically located within another municipality.
- CM: How much would the wear and tear of traffic (parking lot, kids running around) affect maintenance needs? How much maintenance would be required for active sports fields? How expensive would this be?
 - PS: We do not have a number; but yes, maintenance would be involved.
 - CM: I do not think that is good.
 - PS: We respect that opinion. Consider, however, that the Township currently has no sports fields.
 - CM: There are other sites to consider (which are not contaminated).
- CM: Have there been any P.R. issues with the site in Modena?
 - PS: We are not sure. However, with a site such as this, there is likely to be community concern. For example, at the site in Whitpain Township, "capping" the contaminated material was the only feasible solution. Some in the community wanted the contaminated material trucked out of the site, but this was not feasible. Due to the volume of material and the nature of the

contaminant, this would have created more disruption and increased risk of exposure. Any contaminated site will cause concern. On the other hand, there are hundreds of brownfield and superfund sites that have been repurposed safely.

- CM: I see both sides – the community does not want to bring kids there, and this Committee is hesitant to support this.
- PS: Education is key. People are afraid because they do not know the facts.
- C: How much effort will be required to make the site viable to the public (and ultimately make maintenance worthwhile)?
- CM: When was the last time EPA was involved in the site?
 - PS: We do not know off-hand.
- CM: It looks to me like taxpayers will be hit with the costs of maintenance. Even if we get the grant, the people will be saddled with the maintenance. Maybe in the future we could take this on, but perhaps Connell should sit with the site for now. We are trying to find positive things about this site, which has a volatile history – but at what cost? Is there other land to look at? I think we jumped the gun on this grant application. We said at the last meeting that people are not interested in this site.
 - PS: Submission of the application was approved by the Township.
- PS: Whippain Township received a large grant for their site because the government is very interested in getting these lands back into use. Maintenance will be required for any new site, whether contaminated or not. We need to consider this community's needs for recreational facilities and open space. We (SC) advocate for open space and its benefits, but this does not mean that you will follow through on all recommendations. SC and Chester County believe open space is valuable to the community, but someone will have to pay for it.
- CM: Considering the fact that stormwater issues continue to increase on Brandywine Creek; if we buy this property, and it erodes and washes contaminants downstream, then the Township would be responsible for that.
 - PS: Ida was the worst storm that we have had, and even then, the damage was minimal. It is true that there could be a more catastrophic storm event in the future.
 - CM: The Township should engage an environmental attorney to weigh in on this.
- CM: If DCNR is so eager to fund these projects, why do they not purchase these sites?
 - PS: DCNR does not deal with small sites. They work on the scale of State Parks.
 - CM: The Brandywine Conservancy is not interested and the County is not interested; I find it interesting that no one else wants to purchase the site.
 - PS: I doubt that a private entity would purchase this site.
 - PS: A question to consider - Years down the road, will the successor to Connell be as responsible a landowner/steward? I would personally trust the government more with this responsibility.
- CM: What are the contaminants on site?
 - PS: PCBs (and lead), which are common in rail yards.

- PS: We can include in the plan that we held this discussion. If you decide not to move forward with this site, we might recommend removing it from the Township Official Map (as proposed open space).

NOTES:

Public Opinion Survey Update

- CM: Why is the pond “unfishable”? There used to be a chainsaw manufacturer in that area, which was deemed a hazard. Could something have infiltrated and poisoned the pond?
 - CM: The pond has not been poisoned, from what I have seen. We have been monitoring the pond; it is shallow and has low oxygen levels due to sedimentation. There has been no money to maintain the pond, and it needs to be dredged.

Community Benchmarking

- CM: Are these communities comparable to East Fallowfield? We are a bedroom community – many of these benchmarking communities have businesses.
 - PS: These are all communities from Pennsylvania and nearby. They were chosen based on their comparable populations, geographical size, population density, and income. While some of them are more developed than East Fallowfield, they serve as a comparison for what facilities other like-municipalities have provided their communities. It is not an exact science but is a point of consideration if the Township wants to be competitive in attracting and retaining residents.
- CM: Do we want to compete with these communities, or is there something else that sets this community apart and attracts residents?
- PS: A question to consider when looking at the population projections for the Township - do you want to provide facilities for the growing future population?

Projected Facility Needs

- Former Middle School / New Elementary School (K-5)
 - CM: The School District (SD) did put the easement for a side path on their plans for the new Elementary School.

- CM: A sidewalk is proposed on the site plan along Route 82 only.
- CM: Does anything prevent the community from using SD fields?
 - PS: Maybe. Their plans currently show one football field and one baseball field. We suggested that they could have more than one of each. This could be a partnership between the SD and the Township.
 - CM: If someone is injured on SD property after school hours, who is liable?
 - PS: The SD would not be liable per the PA Recreation Act, as long as property is reasonably maintained.
- Community Park
 - CM: The original master plan showed the driveway to the secondary parking lot (current gravel overflow lot) turning toward the lot closer to the park entrance. This would help to prevent pedestrian/vehicular conflicts within the park.
 - PS: The topography here may make this infeasible. This is something that would require a closer study.
 - CM: There is a stormwater management (SWM) facility at the corner of Strasburg and Route 82 – near the pickleball location on this image. We would have to manage around that.
 - PS: These images are diagrammatic only and would change in actual design. We would need to factor in SWM in any case.
 - CM: Can swales be shown down by the pickleball/volleyball courts?
 - CM: Could a sports field be placed in the open field at the east side of the park? We have discussed placing a ballfield there and using the existing hill as spectator seating.
 - MA: Solar orientation is a consideration. A little league ball field could likely be placed here in the proper solar orientation and with minimal grading. A soccer field would be a tighter fit if oriented per recommendations and would require more grading.
- Potential Township Building Site
 - CM: I think the plan is for this site to be ½ municipal complex and ½ preserved as open space. Do ballfields qualify as open space?
 - Scott Swichar: Did you account for SWM in this concept?
 - Ps: No, not at this stage. There are different ways to address SWM, such as subsurface facilities under the parking lot, which would economize space.
 - C: Do ballfields require SWM?
 - PS: Yes. This site's pre-development state would likely be counted as meadow, and going from a meadow condition to lawn would require SWM.
 - PS: We will add dedicated parking for the park portion of the site.
 - CM: Could the parking be shared by both the municipal complex and the open space portions of the site?
 - PS: Yes. We would likely need more than what is shown here (approximately 40 spaces).
 - CM: That seems like a lot of parking – would that much be necessary?
 - PS: There are parking requirements for buildings, with number of spaces based upon building square footage. However, the number of spaces provided for parks/open space is at the discretion of the designer/planner. We prefer to be conservative in

our estimates, erring on the side of providing “placeholders” for more, which can be reduced if deemed unnecessary.

- West Chester Road parcel
 - PS: We will show the disc golf with an outline only for the next presentation, to demonstrate to the public that disc golf has minimal impact and can be done within woodlands.
 - CM: Are there restrictions on this property? I believe it was deeded by the HOA to the Township with restrictions on use.
 - **Scott Swichar to check in to deed restrictions and inform SC.**
 - CM: There is no parking shown on this diagram – should there be parking here?
 - PS: Perhaps the best place would be on the curve of Brinton Drive – 10-15 spaces?
 - PS: Consider adding a single unit restroom here. There are many options – automatic locking, etc.

Potential Open Space & Rec Expansion / Acquisition

- Parcel 1 – Strasburg Rd. behind Weaver Mulch
 - CM: This site does not smell great (mulch operation)
 - CM: There is a shallow pond (not in great condition)
- Sisk farm
 - CM: Do you know the topography of this site? It is hilly in places.
 - PS: This can be worked around through grading and creating “benches” to provide level areas for facilities.
- Pond/Barn property Buck run
 - One owner here cut down trees along Dennis Run where someone had planted riparian corridors.
- Elem school site
 - Meadow area to west (clearing) was used by children at school for field day. Fox hunts come through here.
 - Conserved property around the site is privately owned and is up for sale.

General Comments/Questions

- PS: Going forward, the Committee will need to discuss recommendations for sidewalks.
- PS: SC to send the Chester County Return on Environment (ROE) report to the Committee.
- Committee Meeting 6 – In the case of inclement weather, SC will notify Scott who will notify the Committee. The Committee is open to holding the meeting virtually, if necessary.



PRESENTATION

Peter Simone (PS), Pankaj Jobanputra (PJ), and Michelle Armour (MA) of Simone Collins (SC) led the group through a brief presentation which included the following elements:

- Introduction
- Project Schedule

- Public Participation Review

- Projected Community Park Facility Needs

- Historic Preservation

- Administrative, Recreation and Maintenance Analysis and Recommendations

- Discussion
- Next Steps

NOTES:

- Question: Does having this report help us when we apply for grants?
 - PS: Yes. DCNR and other agencies want to make sure your community has the big picture in mind. This plan can be used for 10-15 years+.
- Question: Regarding the potential for open space acquisition – what is the impact on homeowners of properties marked in green (potential open space & recreation acquisition)?
 - PS: This map highlights sites that may work for active or passive recreation or open space protection. People worry about eminent domain, but this very rarely happens. If interested in your property, the Township would approach you, the landowner, to open the conversation. There are several possibilities in this case: If you were interested in a conservation easement just to conserve the land, you would receive a tax break for that. In another scenario, maybe it would make more sense, from a tax standpoint, to conserve 50 acres and use the other 50 acres to build 20 houses. Or maybe you would be interested in selling the land to the Township.
We recognize that the Township will never acquire all of the parcels on this map; but if marked on the official map, then the Township has expressed an official desire to potentially acquire a portion or all of that parcel for public use. Let's use the Sisk Farm property as an example – if this property is shown on the official map as potential active recreation, if and when the Sisk Farm owners express interest in selling, the Township has one year to work out a plan and negotiate with the owners. Another example – this can be used to negotiate with developers to put in public trails when developing new developments.
- Comment: We have not talked about the South Brandywine Middle School building – it would make a great space for a variety of community needs: programming for seniors, Township offices, baseball fields, etc.
 - PS: This site is the planned location for the new elementary school. We had a meeting with the School District (SD) regarding their plans. They have one soccer field planned, and we asked if they would accommodate another sports field and walking trails for the community.
 - Comment: The SD did come to a Supervisors meeting and presented a plan with walking paths and ADA accessible fields.
 - Comment: The SD is starting construction soon (next year).

- Comment: Regarding trails – Along the old railroad, off Timacula Rd, there is an historic bridge. A lot of people own properties down there. Some great trails would be: Timacula Rd and the railroad bed; Hephizabah Hill down to Modena and then make a right onto Mortonville Rd; King Ranch, Strump’s property, the brownfield site, and Penndot parcels.
 - Comment: Bicyclists ride 5 abreast and take up the road – they need designated areas. They check in with the Police department, but they only have 2 cars on at a time.
- Comment: Even if getting grants to pay for improvements up front, maintenance costs will go on forever. I think it is telling that wildflower meadows got the most votes on the public opinion survey; we don’t want to be Delaware County. Consider buying parcels and donating them to the Natural Lands Trust so that we don’t have to be responsible for their maintenance.
- Comment: Grants aren’t free – they come out of tax dollars. I grew up in the country, and I lived in Santa Cruz, and they don’t utilize their greenways. People use natural areas, and don’t want ugly drainage ways.
 - PS: Regarding grants – some of the money that is put away is to be used for parks and recreation only – for example, DCNR funds come from real estate transfer tax. If that money doesn’t go to your community, it will go somewhere else. Another example - money from oil leases can only be used for parks and recreation.
 - Comment: We are getting into a habit of tax, tax, tax. Also, it’s not free: there’s maintenance.
 - PS: Consider that some feedback from the community was “please provide anything that my kids can play on.” Also, you mentioned natural areas and open space – many of these parcels could be conserved at no cost to taxpayers (ChesLen preserve is an example of this).
 - Comment: My preservation was my neighbors’ land – I would ride my motorcycle and make friends with my neighbors, and they would let me ride through their land. The survey seems contradictory – people say that they want nature, but then I’m seeing all these paved paths. Let’s let nature be nature. Also, allow the developments to carry the costs of these trails.
 - PS: That is a good idea and consider that someone needs to maintain the trails if they are open for public use.
- Comment: We need sports fields – is there a shortage of organized sports opportunities?
 - PS: Yes, the analysis showed a shortage.
 - Comment: I want to distinguish between organized and pickup games – you will never see teenagers playing pickup games.
- Comment: I am in Modena. Regarding the brownfield site – we have no desire to be a part of this. As soon as you take it on you take responsibility. The current owner gets tax dollars, and Modena needs every tax dollar. Consider the upkeep and testing on the site, and the insurance costs. Right now, the private company that owns the site is taking care of it as they should. The site cannot be used for anything.
 - PS: The site could be used for recreation. We are currently working on a former brownfield/ Superfund site in Whitpain Township for a community park.
- Comment: The Goosetown road parcel was donated to the Township. It would be nice for a nature park – no big parking lot. The left side was part of Strunk’s property – there are some

buildings, a field, wetlands. The other side was owned by the paper mill. Most people are looking for biking/walking trails, and this site would be good for that.

- PS: And the emergence of e-bikes has made places that were previously inaccessible more accessible.
- Comment: I have seen it work well in California where a city or county closed off a road on the weekend – it creates a peaceful area.
 - PS: We have discussed this for Mortonville Rd.
- Comment: Regarding the brownfield site Mortonville Rd – I would suggest that we do not consider it – our Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) does not want to take it on.
 - Comment: I agree. I have worked on hazmat jobs. I have been opposed to the brownfield site for years. It would need to be a collaboration with Modena Borough. We have other areas to use.
- Comment: South Coatesville has approved a subdivision of 117 townhouses and 80-some single-family homes at Buck Run and Upper Gap Rd.
- Question: Regarding the Township’s West Chester Rd parcel – how close does that come to the new development planned in Caln Township?
 - PS: The new development will be directly north of the parcel.
- Comment: People have complained that pickleball courts have noise associated with them.
 - PS: They do. Where we’ve shown them in the conceptual layout for the Wilmington Rd parcel, and we believe they are far enough from homes; and in Community Park, we are proposing berms to shield the noise.
- Question: The Township Park is open from dawn to dusk – how many improvements would require lighting?
 - PS: None requires it – that would be a Township decision.
- Question: This is an Open Space, Recreation, and Environmental Resources plan; you mentioned historic and cultural resources in the presentation – can you work that into the mission statement?
 - PS: Yes, several of the parcels we are looking at touch on the historic and cultural landscape. We can work historic and cultural resources into the mission statement.
- PS: There are no standards for how much preserved open space a community should have. One way to mitigate development is to preserve land. A bond issue was approved by residents of Westtown Township for Crebilly Farm – they found the open space to be valuable enough; so open space preservation is not free, but there are options. It was a ballot initiative. Another example is the West Bradford Embreeville site. An attendee mentioned earned income tax – this is another possible source of funding.



MEETING SUMMARY:

- JT: I think you're looking at the right stuff for trails and parcels, having a plan will set Twp up for successful grant apps. With the way you're documenting need for things, don't know any parcels that County has set sites on to preserve.
- JT: Brandywine Conservancy might be working with landowners on easements we're not aware of.
- JT: Think the establishment of need and identification where you might need more facilities and areas of acquisition and improvements is the Wilmington Road parcel. With County Open Space grant funding, when we do provide funding for park development, we require land to be preserved in perpetuity as parks and open space. If the Township applies for funding and proposes a municipal facility at this site, the part that is not occupied by this facility will have to be open space or park areas.


- JT: Another group to contact would be Chester County Water Resources Authority – their website has beautiful maps in terms of flooding, looking at land acquisition. They can also help with stormwater management.
- JT: Can't speak to safety on road users, this is a good question for the community planner. There should be an open space planner to speak to for more local level information on flooding.
- JT: Good to contact Brandywine Conservancy for information on allowing public access corridors on easements.
- JT: County is looking to help with the recreational needs of growing populations and changing demographics. If Twp is looking to acquire sites outright, like the Beagle Club, what is its purpose going to be? We have a climate action plan that County adopted last year, there's lot of actions for County or for individuals and municipalities – like woodland preservation.
- JT: Think you're covering everything. I think water access is important, think it's okay to have trails, with DCNR funding. In terms of accessibility, when you have natural trails on steeper slopes, it doesn't lend itself to accessibility.
- JT: County will fund stuff Twp owns or has interest in, we wouldn't fund roads or trails on private property, could be other avenues through PennDOT, for example.
- JT: Some municipalities are seeing a desire for cricket facilities.
- JT: You talked about maybe closing Mortonville Road on weekends. People are willing to bike on roads with heavy traffic when they're closed in places like West Chester and Phoenixville. Closing Mortonville on Sundays in the summer could be a possibility.

MEETING SUMMARY:

General Comments/Questions

- Someone at the previous concert filled out a paper survey and turned it in to Denise – **SC to put in manually for results.**
- Clare Small-McEvoy (CSM): Fan of getting a ballfield, courts, pickleball, but worry about putting these in the current East Fallowfield Township (EFT) Park; too residential. Do not want disturbance for residents at Bradford Village. Maybe place at new EF Elementary. Residents do go elsewhere to enjoy these things and they shouldn't have to (including the little league in Coatesville).
 - Pankaj Jobanputra (PJ): **Behind the school building could be a good location for active recreation facilities.**
- CSM: Concerns about the pond at EFT Park. Fred Weiss is a board member who was going to be on this call; he will be on the pond volunteers call tomorrow.

- Teri Dickinson (TD): Concern – Why aren't we focusing more on improvement of our existing park – ADA playgrounds, shade covering, revitalize pond for catch & release, improve trails inside park, western side bridges, sign markers.
 - CSM: I agree with Teri; ***the initial phase should focus more on what we have and can improve vs. new. There are opportunities to make improvements within the park.***
- PJ: What do you think of the access road connecting into the trail system – regarding ADA accessibility?
 - TD: The loop trail is great – dog walkers and runners come from the neighborhood. Would not want biking through park. Don't really want pro bikers cutting through the park.
- CSM: ***Parking lot needs to be evaluated.***
 - TD: Unpaved parking exists below the lot. People park all the way down past kiosks – and the grass gets torn up. Could be improved easily.
- TD: The board has been reformed in the last 2-3 years. I've been chair for 3 years. Trying to add additional events. Good turnout at concerts: 4th of July, Easter egg hunt, trunk or treat; exploring more ideas for events.
- TD: Have we approached the School District for use of future fields?
 - PJ: ***SC can put that in the report recommendations.***
 - TD: If there are fields in the Township, we can become part of the regional tournaments run by United Sports. We ***can charge a fee for renting out fields. We need to get fields somewhere in the Park.***
 - PJ – Possibility also at the Wilmington Road site.
- Jeanne Berlin (JB): The park Master Plan has fields – not in good location.
 - TD: There may be pushback for facilities like that in the Community Park.
 - JB: A lot of money was put into that engineering because that was what the Township wanted. There are also plans for a bridge over the stream. ***Maybe include a discussion about this at the next committee meeting.***
- TD: Survey answers depend on who is answering – older people at the meetings want passive recreation and younger people want more active recreation. ***We don't have anything for teenagers.*** There has been more graffiti in the last couple of weeks on benches from bored teens. ***We need a basketball court or other active outlet for the kids.***
 - CSM: I was speaking more to concerns about pickleball in EFT Park because of noise concerns for Bradford Village, but I think they would like facilities like a basketball court, etc.
- Other parcels:
 - West Chester Road
 - TD: West Chester Road is very busy – ***if there is a tot-lot there, it will need heavy protection and safe road crossings along West Chester Road.***
 - Parcel at Strasburg & Buck Run Rd (w/ pond, across from EFT Park)
 - TD: The parcel across from the park was purchased by a young couple who wanted to start a nursery/daycare – this fell through during Covid. They fixed up the pond.
 - East Fallowfield Elementary
 - TD: Knock down building and use the whole site.
 - School was built by residents.
 - Has bomb shelter in basement.
 - Discussion regarding preserving building façade.


- Probably wouldn't repurpose school building for new Township building as it needs too much work.
 - Historic Cemetery Site (AME Church)
 - TD: Reach out to John Neilson.
 - Would be great to acquire this site as a historic site.
- Misty Loop Trail
 - JB: Would need to be a combination of on- and off-road trails.
- JB: Do you prioritize things?
 - PJ: Yes, in terms of time, costs, and partners; low hanging fruit vs. pie in sky.
 - JB: Something along the Brandywine that is already in Chester County's plans might be easier to implement; someone has already looked at it vs. starting from scratch.
- Athletic organizations/groups that EFT residents participate in:
 - District 28 Little League
 - EBYA (East Brandywine)
 - Coatesville Area
 - WBYA (West Brandywine) – soccer, softball
 - Southern Chester County Babe Ruth League (does this still exist?)
 - Private providers
 - Striders, Speed City West, Brandywine
- Other groups to reach out to
 - Disc golf group - plays at Kerr Park
- Thoughts on a dog park
 - TD: Not in EFT Community Park
- TD: We have not done fundraising in the last 3 years. All events at the park are currently free; would like more events that charge a fee to raise funds for maintenance.
 - JB: Pavilion rental
 - \$250 deposit, \$100 for day use. Only busy at graduation, and sometimes in the fall, etc. – but not a booming business.
- Safety concerns
 - Lighting
 - CSM: Lighting at the park/park access/roads – there is none currently.
 - JB: That was in original park rules – no lighting – had to fight for light on the flag.
 - CSM: Challenging for night concerts/trunk or treat.
 - TD: Have to ask Fire Dept. to bring mobile lights when needed; but electrical facilities are locked up. Need more electricity for outside events.
 - Cameras
 - Have cameras around bathrooms.
 - Supposed to put cameras in at the parking lot, but there's no light there. Also, not sure how much crime there is to warrant that.
- TD: The rain garden with the sign is showing signs of erosion. It is no longer functioning because the road crew mowed it shortly after it was put in. Need to be revitalized and properly maintained.
- TD: We need additional trees along paved paths. We put 26 trees in 2 ½ years ago.

MEETING SUMMARY:

- Pond has been fished out, doesn't support much of a fish population right now.
- We have seen a decrease in fish, also water quality, parameter that drives us is dissolved oxygen, we have seen lowest dissolved oxygen, down to .1. The pond is sedimented in, maybe 5 feet. Pond weed grows, and close to surface, you can barely walk in. The oxygen is so low, plants must be using it up or evapotranspiration is taking place (this refers to the process which moves water from the surface to the atmosphere). Conditions are poor, even weeds have gotten worse, and because of buffer planting, access for fishing is limited.
- We've intentionally planted a lot to get trees growing and protect the pond from the Sun. Reality is we will need to dredge pond or get in aerator in, not sure aerator will get us there, heart of matter is pond. The Chainsaw factory was there before, and this was the water source for any fires. Trees were dropped and you get sedimentation. The inflow and outflow are not steady enough.
- There's an outflow toward Buck Run Road, there's a green pipe, it's an overflow pipe, fed by groundwater discharges, once it was connected to Dennis Run.

Sediment has probably closed off groundwater. Chester County Water Resources Authority seemed to think inflow was on opposite side of Buck Run, at wetlands.


- We built boardwalk as pond started gaining users, we were trampling wetlands, we then built a bridge to prevent people trampling. Meadow does a good job of managing runoff. Also, there's not much movement in the pond.
- One thing we have to watch out for with dredging is geotechnical stability. If you draw down, it changes the geotechnical capability of soils, so it has to be environmentally compatible.
- Largely, pond weed is the main flora. You have submerged vegetation and floating vegetation, it's a mixture of scum and pollen. We've had a terrific increase in the physical increase of the pond, something has changed, it's well vegetated. There's not much erosion, and access is limited. We monitor phosphorus, we do not have phosphate or a nitrate problem, so it must be something atmospheric. We had a discussion with the Township about pollen scum, and we are pushing for a professional to come. Folks see it as a resource and are bothered by the floating vegetation.
- In terms of fish. I've seen quite a few bass, two huge carp and sunfish and they looked vibrant. Carp have disappeared, and a few sunfish have formed a gravel nest. Can't say whether the pond was fished off or fish were dying off, it is catch and release.
- Access is limited. Other than the fishing pier, there are a couple little paths, otherwise most of the perimeter is protected and 75% is engulfed in vegetation. Vegetation should be cut back where the handicap accessible feature is. Maintenance does a good job cutting, they go out there and do their job. They mulch and trim but it's a tough environment.
- As far as additional features or facilities in the Park, the meadow is sloped, so something like baseball wouldn't work. There's a grove of trees that protects the surrounding neighborhood from sound. There's also no connection on the right side of the pond, there's a fiber trail underneath but it's overgrown, and there's no real return trail so we need a feature that returns people to the trail proper.
- There's a handicap accessible entry at the circle on the south side. Piers could be built for additional access.
- We need new bridges; all are in rough shape. We had a project in place to build a new bridge over Dennis Run but the cost was too high. This was going to be at the trail on the west side.

MEETING SUMMARY:

- I know there's a call for more fields, but do we really need little league because our population is relatively small? There are leagues in adjoining municipalities that we can and do participate in.
- The western side of Community Park is an unofficial walking area, maybe more parking could be placed here.
- The Goosetown Road parcel was gifted. The Township's Newlinville lots have well water, and they are restricted to open space. We don't want to make a parking lot there. The Goosetown lot is deed restricted for no improvements, it's limited to gravel improvements and parking, maybe you could have some rustic camping here. Newlinville might have been gifted as well. The biggest issues in Newlinville are stormwater management and traffic calming.
- The biggest issue with the Misty Loop Trail is with connections. Ideal goal would be to connect neighborhood trails and the planned Chester Valley Trail extension in Coatesville.
- The brownfield site could be preserved as natural lands.


- In terms of trails, you show a trail along Route 82, which we discussed in the committee meetings. Note that when you go up Youngsburg Road, there're developing 60 housing units on one side and 60 on the other side in South Coatesville.
- One goal is to connect to the Chester Valley Trail and HOAs along West Chester Road, which is relatively flat and straight.
- Consider what can and can't be done on Frog Hollow Road, it connects to covered bridges.
- There are no new land development plans right now. Ridge Crest and Pelham Place are the newest subdivisions. They are along the Misty Loop Trail.
- Look at something in the northwest part of the Township to bridge the gap between Newlinville and the rest of the Township. The wooded lot opposite the Park next to the storage facility might be an opportunity.
- Experienced cyclists use the hilly roads throughout the Township.
- A dog park could be an option, the question would be where to put it and how to manage parking.
- I also like the idea of a ball field in the open field between the loop trail in Community Park.
- Maybe a parking lot for the Park could be located at Doe Run and Strasburg. Maybe the area around Strasburg and Route 82 could become a village commercial area, so things like a dog park, parking, trailheads, a fixed bridge could lend to the character.

MEETING SUMMARY:

- Caln Township Little League started in the late 50s, it merged with Coatesville Little League. We have a far-reaching group of members, there are 11 townships that we cover, south and west of Coatesville. We have about 700-800 participants each spring; in the fall we have 300-400. It's a large league.
- We primarily play at Caln Municipal Park, it's ages 4-18, also use Scott Field in Coatesville, there's 2 fields there. We will use Coatesville High School, we use the JV fields more for practice, also 4 fields at Caln Elementary, next to Municipal Park. We are self-maintained and are dependent on volunteers. We have relationships with Caln Township to maintain all the grass, the School District also maintains their grass for properties we use. We also maintain the dirt infield.
- Pat Stasio (PS) – Do have ballfield draggers?
- We have an aged groomer, our work horse, also have flat drags and rakes. Fields get weeded between July-August.

- PS - Do you transport dragger field to the field?
- Groomer is based at Caln Municipal Building, and we can drag it, we have flat drags at every field, there's also a workhorse tracker, both are old. Fields at Caln Municipal Building are lit fields, they are used from September to November, then March to July.
- PS - Are you responsible for field lining?
- Yes, also field usage, we have 2 snack bars.
- We have sponsors that do fertilizing and weeding. We have just 3 fields at Caln Municipal Building, they cut grass, we do everything else.
- PS – What about ballfield mix?
- We have an agreement with the School District that we will maintain part of their fields, we take care of the dirt.
- PS- Are there agreements with the School District and other townships?
- We have contracted agreements, long standing relationship, we also help with fences.
- PS – Are there any other leagues that have started up?
- All travel kids play inside our recreation organization. We get contacted by travel programs for adult leagues, we lose control of maintenance, so we stopped with other leagues. We'll get calls from travel organizations, try to incentivize kids to stay, nothing has popped up that has forced our hand.
- PS – Are you guys responsible if games are played or not played?
- On us and coaches, we put it in the hands of coaches. Coaches are also responsible for keeping the field clean.
- We don't have synthetic fields, but we'd like them. The School District uses them, we can use them if we need to.
- PS - How are you situated with game day and practice fields?
- In the fall we're good, in spring, we're doubling up teams on the same field. In the spring it's a juggling match for 60-, 75- and 90-foot fields.
- PS - In the fall, is it specifically for baseball and football or do you have to share?
- All for baseball and softball. If we go to Scott Field, the Kid Raiders are there.
- PS - Are your fees in line with other communities?
- They're average if not lower, we took samples of other leagues, and we're in line with everyone.
- We start practice in middle of March, usually done by early July; In the fall we kick off in late August and go to the first week in November.


- PS – Do you handle all registration, or do the townships help advertise?
- Yes, it comes through us, we are responsible for umpires and training.
- PS - If you have a list of equipment that you use, could you send that?
- We have more aggressively researched trying to replace our lights, our primary field lights are ancient, at least 60 years old. We've talked to local installers. Fields will also need to be replaced.
- PS - Any issue getting coaches?
- It's a never-ending challenge, we have over 150 coaches, we have to start to train coaches a little better. We have a good core group of umpires; it's always work in progress.
- We have 100-150 kids from East Fallowfield, all children that attend Coatesville Area School District can play at Caln LL. East Fallowfield came to us when we merged with Coatesville, brought in the entire School District.
- If there's space for us in the eastern part of the Township, we would definitely use fields.
- If you look at other leagues, soccer is all private, there's FC Delco and EBYA. West Bradford also has lacrosse and soccer.
- Access to trails would be great, The Pelham Place HOA lands are a common area and are tied into Township space.
- Sometimes we get very heavy rain at the School District property and there's some flooding back in the fields.

MEETING SUMMARY:

- There's some crime here and there in the Park, like vehicular break-ins, which we are hoping to alleviate with cameras. There's also domestic crime here and there, but it's generally one of the nicer, safer areas in the Township.
- In terms of roads, dangerous areas are Mortonville Rd, Strasburg Rd. We see bicyclists there. Hephzibah Hill is also dangerous. On West Chester Pike, people come off of South Caln, then go to Misty Patch, it's still potentially dangerous. East Fallowfield is pretty much all back roads, and it's hard for cars to pass bicycles.
- Accidents aren't bicycle related, there are 2 regular accidents a week, and bike accidents are not always reported. Can't recall any pedestrian accidents.
- For the school, there are no safety issues I can think of, would have to monitor Megan's Law people, officers would have to monitor that, we know who's registered.
- There's vandalism to cars in the Park, since we put cameras up, crime has declined. Cameras went up at around same time as bathrooms.


- For community events, we have a few officers with tents set up. We will do interactions with community members. People are in good behavior, we had one incident with a little scuffle, but safety wise, it's been pretty good.
- Lighting would be good, there's adequate lighting on the flagpole, until the Park closes at dusk, then police are in.
- The Police Department has 7 full-time employees, including sergeant and chief, and 4-5 part-time employees. We have newer vehicles, and we have the latest equipment. We can light up the Park with 2 vehicles. Cameras are set up in the parking lot, bathroom, playground and woods.
- For the Goosetown Road parcel, if you set up mountain biking, you could do a great loop and alleviate bike riding on back roads.
- There is a lot of open space in East Fallowfield.
- There's a flat space in the Park, would be nice to see something there. There were plans for a baseball field, have something like that and maybe courts.
- Haven't heard any issue with trails near homes. Whenever there's construction, we get noise complaints.
- I don't think a noise complaint with pickleball would happen where the school is. There's already a playground there, surrounded by trees, on Strasburg Rd. I don't know if they will keep the building, but this could be a good site for a dog park.
- In terms of EMS, we just put in an AED at the Park. I don't recall incidents at the Park. There's easy access for EMS, we've driven to the pond. There's always issues in wooded areas to get a stair chair or gurney back there. EMS is provided by Westwood and Modena Fire Companies; they have a fire truck and ambulance. They are CPR certified, and everyone knows AEDs.
- In terms of flooding, Hephzibah Hill Rd gets big rocks, washes out, it's probably the worst area. South Caln used to flood, but a developer fixed it. It would freeze during winter.

MEETING SUMMARY:

General Comments/Questions

- John Goodall (JG): The Beagle Club is owned by 15 people. They had beagles. The Township changed the zoning to MH to give that right, but it was never exercised. Became 4 owners, who liquidated and sold to others. The site is gorgeous, exercise with Modena for acquisition. If this is a high priority, I agree with you. It is a beautiful property.
- JG: There is a deed restriction on the East Fallowfield Elementary School property; we might want to do a title search.
- JG: We were involved with the acquisition of the Goosetown Rd parcel. Brandywine Conservancy (BC) was contacted 15 years ago, they did not want it, BC went to the Township, and they said yes. They placed an easement on the property for open space, then transferred over to the Township. There is evidence of camps, deer hunting. Mountain laurel grows here. There is a challenge; maybe have small development that could have access in and a loop trail of some kind. It is big enough to be something. If you could do first right of refusal with the owner next door, might be open, you have lot and house that could be used for something like a community center.

- JG: If there was an open space component to Caln Twp, and if it was contiguous to the wooded area, you're looking at a larger continuous area of the wooded area.
- Rob Daniels (RD): HOAs – my experience is that they are generally fine with internal trails, but not external trails, especially if there is cost associated with maintenance. I do know that a big goal of Chester County is to do outreach to HOAs, looking for opportunities for trail connections and green stormwater infrastructure. The County is interested in increasing dialogue. Generally, HOAs are opposed to connections to outside of the development. My neighboring development has trails.
- JG: The Misty Patch Trail is a loop trail that gives access to the greater trail network. With the HOAs, you might find someone who champions it.
- JG: The brownfield site – it is an underutilized opportunity, just for planting trees, flood mitigation, or a passive park. All industrial uses upstream, I am not sure what the hazardous material on site is.
- RD: It needs to be constantly mowed because of the clay liner; we do not want to have woody species to compromise the clay liner.
- JG: The site has come before me a few times. I've been working for the Conservancy for 25 years, live near East Fallowfield. I have never really seen hard documentation. Every 5-10 years, someone reaches out for partnership.
- RD: Given the proximity to Modena, which is resource strapped, this is a huge opportunity. What are the constraints here?
- JG: You can reach out to DEP; someone gave it a brownfield designation. Someone has done prescriptive work or management plan due to the fencing and stonework.
- JG: I would do a title search to start; this would show any litigation. Call DEP/EPA and maybe the Conservation District if nothing pops up. There was some manmade damage in the past, but we do not know what it is.
- RD: When you go to Chesco Views, you can see there were rail lines on the property.
- RD: I know they closed the bank side of Mortonville Rd., maybe we keep this one way. If 2 vehicles were coming, maybe wait for one to pass. It is not really a road that gets you anywhere; there are so few residential neighborhoods there.
- JG: If you close Mortonville Road on weekends, gently introduce the idea. Maybe the beer garden wants to have events, you close the road for easier access to the beer garden. It can slowly build into something.
- JG: Easements are agriculture-focused and resource protection. In the southern portion of the Township, you have 20-acre zoning and really complements it here, it's a 20-acre site of first order streams, there's also protection of water bodies for the Brandywine, they are resource centric. At Rte. 82 and Buck Run, it is pretty much open.
- JG: If the Beagle Club becomes an open space, that would be great. If there are trails, access can come from the side road, we did a study for it a few years ago.
- RD: If there were funding requirements, it is not difficult to get funding. This would serve a wider population than just East Fallowfield; it would be joint application with Modena, and the landowner would have to be open to dialogue. There is a need for active and passive recreation, and I would be concerned if East Fallowfield got taken over by active recreation – this would leave little space for passive recreation. It would be beneficial to get more property for passive recreation, like the brownfield site.
- JG: We have 15,000 visitors annually at the Laurels. You have to be a member of the Conservancy to use it. Parking is limited to 12 spots – we keep it that way to enhance the serenity of the preserve.

- RD: East Fallowfield is in the Brandywine Creek Greenway initiative, hopefully something that will continue. This is a resource assisting with open space, recreational projects, and access to intelligent people like John.



General Comments/Questions

- Peter Simone (PS): You have one field at the top of Community Park; this may be something that needs to be addressed. At the last public meeting, we did not hear many “nos”; maybe we interpret this as a “yes” for fields. Our inclination would be to try to move forward with adding facilities at Community Park.
- Jeanne Berline (JB): Except for dog park, I am all in.
- Terri Dickinson (TD): Concept – a dog park at the W. Chester Rd. parcel.
- TD: I’m seeing an influx of affordable housing. If we are to have an influx of seniors, now is the time to address their needs by having more senior amenities close by for them to enjoy, fitness circuits, ADA accessible trails, more shade, good lighting, benches, etc.
- PS: As more people come into the Twp, there really is no opportunity to do active sports in Community Park outside of courts. These things are in the original master plan; it would be good to proceed in that direction.
- TD: A possibility would be to use half of the Wilmington Road site for open space, we support grants for this. The site could be used for fields, and that might be possible if we have half of the ground – we could put at least 1-2 pickleball courts there which would not be affecting Brooks Crossing and Branford Village.
- PS: We may want to look at other locations for sports fields to meet deficiencies.
- TD: The Middle School will become a K-4 school.
- TD: On any given Saturday in the summer, there were 1-2 parties in the Park pavilion. We applied for a grant for electricity and lighting on the gazebo, which would make it a better rental space.
- PS: My recollection is that the trail around the pavilion is handicap accessible, and then the trail that comes down from there is not handicap accessible. If you went around the pavilion, I think the curvy path is handicap accessible.
- TD: Have you done studies in neighboring parks to see how often courts are used?
- PS: Tennis is probably not used as often. The local government is better positioned to take care of the Mortonville site. It has a good possibility of being acquired by the Township if the supervisors approve it. The next step would be a site master plan. You could raise the elevation of the soil and plant small trees to get shade. It could be a nice, passive site or boat launch; a place to informally throw frisbee; maybe most of it could be meadow.
- PS: As Teri said, another location besides Community Park would be better for a dog park; maybe it is up at W. Chester Rd.
- JB: Disc golf would be good at the W. Chester Rd. site.
- TB: The Fieldcrest Village HOA was talking about donating land for a trail.
- PS: They seemed engaged; we talked about this. This would be good.


- TB: The Township got a grant for Newlinville traffic calming. Triple Fresh BBQ will also be moving to their new location at Sisk Farm.

General Comments/Questions

- John Nielsen (JN): Older developments do not have sidewalks.
- Peter Simone (PS): A lot of younger folks – younger married couples who have moved from places like West Chester, Manayunk, or other places with sidewalks – probably responded to wanting more sidewalks on the survey.
- Rob Daniels (RD): Not sure that Strasburg Rd. warrants on-road facilities because of traffic, sight lines. I think off-road is impossible because of development. If there was a desire for an east/west bike route, once you get into the park, in terms of priorities, it is very difficult. I think 98% of the cycling population is a no-go for Strasburg east of the park.
- JN: I always notice bicyclists in the early mornings.
- RD: I used to bike the Brandywine, Misty Patch is nice to ride, and I think Mortonville is primed for some kind of trail. I use Frog Hollow a lot – it was a little busier when bridges were out.
- JN: We have an opportunity for connection with Caln Township; of all the ways to get to Rte. 30, the W. Chester Rd. site would be safest, key is making sure there is a sidewalk connection.
- JN: For the 30 acres that are there, DCNR can send a forester to identify what invasives are there.
- PS: They may provide some kind of service like that.
- RD: The forester of the region can send someone out to look at the trees and do a simple woodland assessment.
- JN: There is an abandoned property there which has been vacant for 3 years. Also, there's a road called Rhoda Lane, which could provide access to the site. Of all the parcels we have, this W. Chester Rd. site is a decent size for a preserve, or walking trail, try to improve to its most sustainable and highest use.
- PS: Think additional trails could be warranted. The W. Chester Rd. site has also been mentioned as a possible location for a dog park.
- RD: Could there be meadows or pollinator gardens here?
- JN: You would be getting rid of mowing 5-15 acres, plus you have the added benefits of meadows – it would be a win-win.
- RD: This site has a lot of opportunities. If the site adjacent to the Goosetown Rd site becomes available, maybe it could be used for something. Regarding passive and active recreation, we are looking at how Community Park can fulfill active recreation needs. We will look at other sites and see whether these sites can fulfill active and passive recreation needs. If farmland along Rte. 82 could be acquired, it could be used for fields.

- PS: I think we have to see the willingness for acquisition of new ground. If the farm was marked on the Township's Official Map as open space, you would have more of a say as to how this gets developed. We are exploring a side trail along Rte. 82. There is a lot of topography at the Goosetown Rd parcel. We also have the school district site where a new school will be built – can they develop fields? Also, could 5 of the 10 acres of the Wilmington Rd. site be used as sports fields? How do you pay for all this? It is great to get grants, and some communities also pass an Earned Income Tax (EIT) for open space and maintenance.
- JN: From the surveys we did, the number #1 thing we needed, other than a food store, was a car dealership; the survey asked about types of businesses that would do well.
- PS: You could add the parcel as a piece of open space on the Official Map, which might give you a little more leverage; if we want to develop an off-road trail here, this becomes part of the land development plan.
- PS: If you want to have leverage with developers, putting a site on the Official Map is a way to give yourself more options
- Jeanne Berline (JB): Are easements guaranteed by property owners?
- RD: Yes, easements on the map are preserved in perpetuity.
- PS: Thinking about conserved lands, do you know the process of trying to negotiate trail easements along the perimeter?
- RD: I cannot think of an example of us doing that, that might be an issue with agricultural easement, will not allow them unless they already exist. You will not put a trail on an agricultural easement. An agricultural easement is not the same as Agricultural Security Area (ASA). It is similar to a conservation easement and permanently protects the land and requires it to be farmed. ASA is just protection that enables farmers to do their business without nuisances.
- PS: If Connell is getting rid of (the brownfield) property, you have to maintain it in perpetuity.
- JN: Mill Trail – is it still active?
- RD: It could be reignited. Modena has limited resources and think it would be a huge benefit to them. If Connell wants to get rid of one property, maybe they want to get rid of the other. This would be an opportunity for a great municipal partnership.
- PS: The hurdle is maintenance. Maybe someone like the William Penn Foundation will fund reuse of the site. Maintenance is a long-term responsibility. Maintenance should be relatively minimal. I do not know what funding might be available for emergency repairs – I think you would want to get Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP) money.
- RD: Partnership with Modena would be beneficial: it is an underserved community.
- JN: For most trails you want to have something like a destination.
- PS: If you can have a trail with a destination that would be great; there could also be trail loops – sometimes they do not connect anywhere, or eventually they connect.
- JB: I walk trails to walk trails.
- RD: The Outfitters have a summer beer garden.
- JN: To me, I like “sustainable” rather than “passive.”. With things like activities in the park, like bocce, I'm leaning towards baby steps. If people want something a little more like pickleball, that is step 2.

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

Q1 What is your age?



Q2 How many people currently live in your household?







Q4 Are you a resident of East Fallowfield Township?



Q5 If you live in East Fallowfield, how long have you lived in the Township?



Q6 Do you own or rent your place of residence?



Q11 In general, how important do you feel public parks, trails, natural areas and open spaces are to the well-being and quality of life in East Fallowfield Township?



Q12 In general, how important is the conservation of natural open spaces such as waterways and wooded areas in East Fallowfield Township?







Q36 Do you think East Fallowfield Township needs more sports fields or courts (soccer, baseball, football, tennis, pickleball, basketball, etc.)?



Q46 Do you visit private gyms or workout centers for fitness or recreational purposes?








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Section 1

Introduction

1.1 Project Background

The Modena Yard Site (Site) was formerly used as a scrap yard and railroad car dismantling facility and is located on an approximate 20-acre parcel situated in the Borough of Modena and East Fallowfield Township in Chester County, Pennsylvania. Luria Brothers operated the site from 1922 to 1984. Connell Limited Partnership (Connell) purchased Luria Brothers in March 1987.

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources (PADER, currently the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP)) and the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) performed inspections and sampling on the site in 1987, 1988, and 1998. Elevated levels of lead and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) were detected in soil samples obtained from the Site. However, no other contaminants of concern were indicated on-site.

On September 29, 1999, the USEPA signed into effect the Administrative Order by Consent for Removal Response Action (AOC) for the Site (Docket No. III-99-029-DC). The parties to the AOC (USEPA 1999a) are the USEPA and Connell. Pursuant to the AOC, RMT prepared a Response Action Plan (RAP) detailing the response action to be taken at the Modena Site. Based on an Extent of Contamination Study performed by RMT, the RAP identified site remediation activities designed to eliminate the direct contact exposure pathway for soils exceeding clean criteria for PCBs and lead at the Site. These activities included the excavation and grading of contaminated soils and the installation of a 30-inch final cover consisting of a grading layer, geosynthetic clay liner (GCL), a soil layer, and a topsoil layer.

USEPA approved the RAP on April 19, 2001. On August 3, 2001, RMT commenced construction of the 30-inch final cover at the Modena Yard Site. Site construction activities were essentially completed by January 11, 2001. RMT completed some minor construction items and repairs in the spring of 2002 and demobilized from the site on April 26, 2002. The final site inspection was conducted on May 22, 2002.

1.2 Purpose

This Post-Removal Site Control (PRSC) Plan was prepared in response to a request from USEPA to RMT on behalf of Connell, dated June 13, 2002 and modifications dated June 24, 2002 to

prepare a formal supplement to the RAP outlining plans to inspect, repair and maintain the site in the years following remediation. Specific elements of the site to be addressed include:

- The site cap
- Erosion control features
- The access road
- Site fencing
- Culbertson property

The details of each of these elements including the inspection frequency, reporting, and maintenance requirements, are outlined in the following sections of this plan. The inspections will be documented using a prepared reporting form (see Figure 1), a site inspection plan (see Figure 2) and photographs. The original PRSC was submitted to USEPA in July 2004. Revision 01 of the PRSC was prepared to respond to comments received by RMT in a letter dated September 15, 2004 from Michael Welsh, P.E., the Project Coordinator for USEPA.

Section 2

Site Maintenance Elements

2.1 Site Cap

2.1.1 Construction

The site cap is the primary environmental design feature at the Modena Yard Site. The cap consists of the following elements from bottom to top:

- **Grading Layer:** An approximate 6-inch thick grading layer was placed and compacted above the regraded waste material. The grading layer provides a smooth uniform surface to support the geosynthetic clay liner (GCL). The grading layer soil consists of processed material from quartzite screening operations obtained from County Line Quarry, Inc. in Wrightsville, PA.
- **Geosynthetic Clay Liner (GCL):** A GCL was placed above the grading layer to completely cover the underlying regraded waste material. Bentonite was also placed across the width of the overlap seam between the top and bottom of overlapping liner sheets.
- **Cover Soil Layer:** A two-foot layer of cover soil was placed above the GCL. The soil is a combination of general fill (non-granular) and topsoil. The material was obtained from a previously undeveloped construction site located in Downingtown at the northwest corner of the intersection of U.S. Route 30 and Pennsylvania Route 100. Mushroom soil was also used as an admix to the topsoil in select areas on site.
- **Vegetative Cover:** With the exception of the entrance, access roads, and erosion control areas, the cap has a grassed cover with one of the seed mixtures listed in Table 2-1.

2.1.2 Cap Inspection

The site cap will be inspected semi-annually by a representative of RMT or other person designated by Connell. The capped area will be walked in a series of east-west traverses as shown on Figure 2. The inspector will note maintenance items on the reporting form as shown in Figure 1 including but not limited to:

- Bare spots or stressed vegetation requiring reseeding
- Erosion or gulying of the two-foot cover soil layer
- Erosion through, tearing, or other violation of the GCL

Any areas requiring repair will be flagged in the field and the location indicated on the inspection copy of the site plan. A photo-documentation log of any damaged areas will also be maintained.

2.1.3 Cap Repairs

Any deficiencies in elements of the cap will be repaired within 60 days by patching or replacement of soil and/or GCL materials equivalent in design, performance, and installation to the original construction. Reseeding will use a seed mix similar to that in Table 2-1 as provided by United Horticultural Supply. Reseeding, mulching and fertilization will be accomplished within thirty days of soil placement, but no later than November 1st and no earlier than April 1st to allow for proper germination and maturation. Any patching of the GCL will involve a minimum six-inch overlap of GCL layers and placement of a bentonite seal between the laps.

2.1.4 Mowing

The vegetative cover at the site shall be mowed twice each year: once during the period between June 1 to June 30, and once during the period of September 30 to October 30. The objectives will be to control the growth of taproot vegetation and to maintain an environment for the healthy growth of the cover grasses. The fall mowing will be accomplished prior to the fall inspection to allow increased visibility of the soil conditions beneath the vegetation during inspection.

2.2 Erosion Controls

2.2.1 Construction

Erosion control features on site consist of shoreline protection along Brandywine Creek and drainage swales across and around the capped area:

- **Shoreline Protection:** Erosion controls along the toe of the slope that terminates into the Brandywine Creek consist of a Pyramat erosion control blanket and riprap. An 8-foot wide apron of Pyramat was laid and stapled along the slope of the embankment of Brandywine Creek. R-5 stone (8-inch to 12-inch material) was placed from the lower edge of the Pyramat toe of the slope into the Brandywine Creek. R-4 stone (4-inch to 8-inch material) was then placed behind the R-5 stone over the Pyramat such that at least 50% of the Pyramat was reinforced with riprap.
- **Storm Water Drainage Swales:** Two drainage swales were constructed at the Site to convey storm water runoff (see Figure 2). One swale is parallel to the north property line and is located in the eastern section of the Site). This swale conveys storm water from a 24 or 18 inch corrugated metal pipe (CMP) to the creek. The CMP conveys runoff from the north to south side of Mortonville Road. The swale is covered with geotextile fabric and lined with riprap. The second swale is located parallel to the west property line and conveys storm water from a culvert under Mortonville Road from the northwest corner of the site south to the creek.
- **Buried Storm Drain (Culvert):** Early in 2003, a post-removal inspection revealed a water boil beneath a capped area of the site caused by upwelling from a truncated and buried concrete-lined steel storm drain. In July 2003, a 60-foot long 24-inch diameter polyethylene drain pipe extension was coupled to the storm drain and installed to a discharge at Brandywine Creek. The pipe was backfilled, the GCL liner patched, and vegetative cover re-established over the pipe excavation.

2.2.2 Inspection of Erosion and Sedimentation Controls

Erosion controls will be inspected semi-annually, simultaneous with the cap inspection, unless otherwise noted below. The inspector will photo-document and note maintenance items on the reporting form as shown in Figure 1 including but not limited to:

- Failures in the riprap pavement
- Damaged geotextile and Pyramat sections
- Areas of excessive soil erosion and or sediment loss or deposition
- Blockage of drainage swales or CMPs with debris or excess soil buildup
- Area of buried storm drain extension for evidence of upwelling from beneath cap (performed at least once annually during a rainfall or snow-melt event)

Any areas requiring repair will be flagged in the field and the location indicated the inspection copy of the site plan.

2.2.3 Erosion and Sedimentation Control Repairs and Measures

The following deficiencies in elements of the erosion and sedimentation control system will be repaired within 60 days:

- Elements of the drainage swales or shoreline protection will be repaired within 60 days by patching or replacement of geotextile, riprap, or Pyramat materials equivalent in design, performance and installation to the original construction.
- Areas exhibiting excessive delivery of sediment from the cap surface to Brandywine Creek will be controlled by the installation of temporary silt fencing until cap repairs have been successfully accomplished and proper vegetation established.
- Any debris blocking CMPs or swales will be removed and disposed off site.
- Any area of upwelling of storm water in the vicinity of the buried storm drain will be excavated and repaired and the overlying liner and cover restored, as outlined in the first bullet of this subsection.

2.3 Access Road

2.3.1 Construction

Entrance to the site from Mortonville Road is controlled by the main entrance gate (see Figure 2). This entrance was stabilized using processed aggregate and dense graded aggregate meeting Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PENNDOT) specifications. The site access road was constructed by placing geotextile fabric overlain by an approximate 8-inch thick lift of crushed aggregate (PENNDOT #3 Stone). An approximate 4-inch thick lift of dense graded aggregate base material (PENNDOT #2A Modified) was placed over the crushed aggregate to provide a stabilizing and leveling surface.

2.3.2 Access Road Inspection

Simultaneous to inspection of the cap, the inspector will evaluate the access road for signs of erosion, differential settlement, and excessive roughness. Areas of erosion will be located on the site inspection plan, photo-documented, and noted on the inspection form for future repair.

2.3.3 Access Road Repair and Maintenance

The access road will be maintained to allow site access and to limit the potential for the road to act as a surface-water runoff route. Any erosion of the access road, differential settlement, or excessive roughness will be repaired within 60 days of identification by the placement and grading of dense graded aggregate base material meeting the requirements of PENNDOT #2A, modified.

2.4 Fencing and Security

2.4.1 Construction

The perimeter chain-link fence was placed along the north and west property lines to provide permanent access control (see Figure 2).

2.4.2 Fence Inspection

Simultaneous to each semi-annual inspection the inspector will walk the perimeter of the fence to identify signs of damage or breaches in security. Any breaches or damaged areas will be flagged and photo-documented, and the location noted on the site inspection plan. The gates will be checked for soundness and function and the presence of locks will be verified. The nature of any required repairs will be noted on the inspection report form.

The inspector will also look for any indication of unauthorized vehicular entry to the site. The inspector's will recommend in the inspection report any enhancements to security to stop unauthorized vehicular entry.

2.4.3 Fence Repairs

All fence repairs will be initiated within 30 days.

2.5 Culbertson Property Inspection

Some excavation of waste materials and the installation of a cap were performed on the eastern edge of the Culbertson property. Simultaneous to inspection of other site elements along the western portion of the site the inspector will observe the Culbertson property from the Modena Yard Site and will provide general observations about the condition of the cap. The inspector will also assess the condition of the three trees planted along the eastern boundary of the Culbertson property. Any deficiencies will be photo documented and noted on the reporting form (Figure 1). Any construction related repairs at the Culbertson property would require prior written approval from the landowner.

Section 3

Inspection Reporting

3.1 Schedule

Inspections will be carried out semi-annually; with a spring inspection being performed between March 31 and April 30 and a fall inspection being conducted between September 30 and October 31 after the site has been mowed. One of these inspections will be performed during a rainfall or snow-melt event to evaluate the proper functioning of the drainage swales and the existing storm drain beneath the cap. Within thirty days of the inspection, RMT will submit to the USEPA Region III on behalf of Connell a *Site Inspection Report*. These semi-annual inspections should occur for a period of no fewer than 5 years. At the end of 5 years, Connell may request that EPA reduce the frequency to one required inspection per year. If after 5 years, the frequency of inspections is reduced to once per year, any annual inspection should be conducted during a rainfall or snow-melt event to evaluate the proper functioning of the drainage swales and the existing storm drain beneath the cap.

3.2 Report Contents

The report will be comprised of a brief summary letter of the inspection with a completed report form attached (see Figure 1), a hand marked site plan indicating the location of areas to be repaired, and a photographic log of site photos taken during the inspection. The base for the site plan will be a copy of the Site Inspection Plan exhibited herein as Figure 2. The contents of the *Site Inspection Report* will include inspection of those items listed in Section 2 with recommended actions for approval by USEPA. The report and will also summarize any corrective actions taken during the previous quarter.

Section 4

Future Use Restrictions

4.1 Recreational Use

In the event that USEPA removes restrictions for use of the property by Connell or any other party through agreement, lease or transfer of the property, the use of the property will be limited to recreational purposes and additional due care measures as outlined below will be required.

4.2 Structural Limitations

Placement of permanent structures or grading to provide more level surfaces may not occur any closer than within one foot of the GCL cap. This essentially requires that leveling courses, foundation sub-bases, utilities, and other structural elements must be placed above the granular soil layer immediately above the GCL.

The top vegetative layer may be replaced with an optional vegetated layer to support grasses appropriate to a particular sports playing field needs, however the protective soil layer above the GCL should not be removed.

No structures or structural fill should be placed that will exacerbate runoff or result in erosion of the cap, or blockage of swales, drainage ways or culverts.

Placement of backstops, fencing and other features requiring installation of posts must be completed in fill material above the GCL, and in any event should not penetrate closer than within one foot of the GCL or Pyramat layers.

4.3 Compliance with ARARS

Any construction or filling within the floodplain or floodway must comply with state and local standards. Prior to conducting any filling within the floodplain or floodway, approvals shall be obtained from the Borough of Modena and/or East Fallowfield Township.

4.4 Additional Due Care

In the event that the GCL or Pyramat must be repaired or penetrated, the person(s) or contractor performing that work must have appropriate OSHA approved 40-hour hazardous worker training and be fully informed of the hazards presented by the contaminated materials buried beneath the cap. Transfer of the property or its use will not alleviate the user from the responsibility of conducting inspections and maintenance as provided within this plan.
